**Kirkby's 1950 Yardage Equals Previous Total**

SEATTLE — (AP) — Ready Rollie Kirkby, who does everything for the Washington football team but mow the grass has made 894 yards from rushing in three seasons of play — and exactly the same distance from all his odd-job work in 1950.

With one game left to play in his college career, the Burlington, Wash. Express has gained 364 yards by catching passes this year, 274 yards rushing, 125 returning kickoffs and 127 with intercepted passes. Total 894.

Never missing a game since he entered school, Kirkby rushed for 266 yards as a sophomore and 354 last year. His current 275 yards make the total 894.

**Hamey Acquires Position With New York Yankees**

NEW YORK — (AP) — Roy Hamey, general manager of the Pittsburgh Pirates, is leaving Pittsburgh Dec. 1 to become assistant general manager of the New York Yankees.

The Yankees, who made the announcement Monday, said Hamey would join the world champions in spring training. He will serve as an aide to General Manager George Weiss.

The 48-year-old executive served with the Yankee organization many years before joining the Pirates in 1947.

Hamey's status had been in doubt since Branch Rickey, former boss of the St. Louis Cardinals and Brooklyn Dodgers, took over as a vice president and general manager of Pittsburgh.

**Louis Said 'In Excellent Condition' For Next Bout**

CHICAGO — (AP) — Joe Louis has been pronounced "in excellent condition" for the start of his comeback in a 10-round bout with Cesar Brion at Chicago stadium on Nov. 29.

Louis and Brion both passed physical tests yesterday before the Illinois Athletic commission. Dr. John Houston, commission physician, said Louis' blood pressure and pulse reactions were good.

"Joe's in excellent condition," he reported.

Louis, readying for his first fight since losing to Ezzard Charles, said he was fairly sure he would be lighter than the 218 pounds he totaled in the title bout at New York last September.

**PUMPKIN NUT PIE**  
Cella-Lee Tasted Recipe  
PIE CRUST (enough for 2 single crust pies)

Mix together:  
2 1/2 cups sifted Crown Best Patent Flour, bleached or unbleached  
1/2 teaspoon salt

Cut in:  
1/2 cup cold shortening  
Add a few drops at a time, mixing lightly with a fork.

Roll with fork until particles are slightly moistened. Press into a ball. Toss with fork until particles are dry or pastry cloth for single crust. Roll ball on lightly floured board or pastry cloth.

**FILLING (for one 9-inch pie)**  
1/2 teaspoon salt

Mix together:  
1 1/2 cups cooked mashed pumpkin  
2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice, or a mixture of cinnamon, allspice, cloves and ginger  
1 1/2 cups milk  
1/2 cup sugar

Pour into unbaked pie shell. Gently sprinkle top with 2 tablespoons brown sugar and 1/2 cup finely chopped nuts. Bake in a very hot oven (450°) for about 15 minutes, then reduce heat to 350° for about 30 minutes longer.
