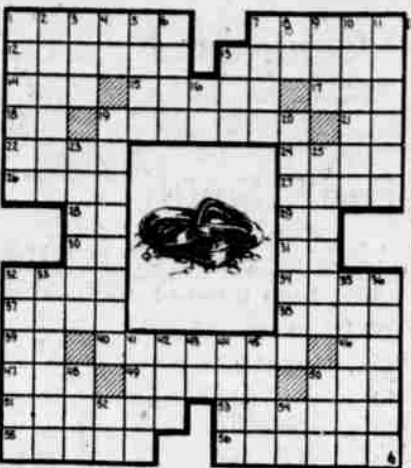

German Socialists' Vote Against Rearming Blow To Western Allies

France has long been the chief stumbling block whenever German rearmament was discussed. But now a new and greater barrier has arisen: Germany itself.

The German Socialists have won three straight state elections as avowed opponents of rearmament. Their most recent triumph came in Bavaria, a part of Germany never before captured by the Social Democratic (Socialist) Party.

No one in Germany doubts that the issue was clear: The Social Democrats' most effective election poster depicted a rifle topped by a steel helmet and stuck into the churned soil of a battlefield. The caption read: "Never again."

No one doubts, either, that the Bavarian result, coming after similar Socialist successes in Hesse and Wurttemberg-Baden, is a serious blow to Western plans to bring Germany into the European defense establishment.

Flushed with victory, Socialist leaders are calling for new national elections on the rearmament issue. There is no sign yet when or if this call will be heeded. But even if it is not, Chancellor Adenauer's Christian Democratic government is certain to be considerably embarrassed by the new turn of events.

Adenauer is already openly committed to a policy of remilitarizing Western Germany. But he can hardly do anything about it in the face of such obvious popular sentiment against it. Unless this trend is somehow interrupted or reversed, his hands will be tied indefinitely.

And that makes German rearmament a question strictly for the professors. For, plainly, a German army will not be created against the will of the German people.

French opposition to a remilitarized Germany was bad enough, but this is worse. There was always the feeling that if the situation grew critical, France would yield and approve German defense units. Nobody is coming up with any bright ideas, however, about how to cope with resistance within Germany itself.

The issue isn't one which can be quietly shelved for a later day. Russia has been welding the so-called "police force" in East Germany into an effective army. Its own armies in East Germany and elsewhere hold a commanding advantage in both manpower and weapons over anything the West can muster in Europe (except the atomic bomb).

It has been recognized for many months that a European defense force without sizable German units

is a hollow shell.

PHILADELPHIA — (AP) — Every one of the nearly fifty thousand Boy Scouts who jammed nearby Valley Forge last July in scoutdom's biggest jamboree is going to get a gift memento of the visit from the publisher of the Philadelphia Inquirer.

The Inquirer said that Walter H. Annenberg, editor and publisher of the Philadelphia Morning Daily, has had printed a booklet called "Jamboree 1950." It is a 48-page, leatherbound book of pictures and story recalling the events of the huge rally.

Dr. Arthur A. Schuck, chief scout executive, said the booklet will be distributed to jamboree veterans through the 541 Boy Scout councils of the nation. It is inscribed to the scouts by Annenberg "In grateful appreciation of the scouts' 40th anniversary crusade 'to strengthen the arms of Liberty'."

The date of distribution was not announced.

Hardwood Plant Near Lebanon To Cost Million

LEBANON — (AP) — The Cascade Plywood corporation has announced plans to build a \$1,000,000 hardwood plant here.

President Charles W. Fox said construction would start this week at the site of the company's present plywood plant south of Lebanon.

He said the plant would use a new and unique method of production — compressing the hardwood without use of water. He said boards varying in thickness from 1.321 of an inch to two inches would be produced.

The plant will make use of waste products from the plywood mill and other mills in the area.

It will take eight to nine months to complete the plant which will

have a capacity of two to three carloads of hardwood daily Fox said.

The number of persons to be employed was not announced.

The corporation also said construction would start this week to add 3500 feet of floor space to company offices here.
