The group of negro spirituals include "Who Built the Ark," arranged by Hall Johnson; "Sweet Little Jesus Boy," by MacGimsey de Paur; "Jesus Hung an' Died," by Ulysses Elam; "Every Mail Day," arranged by Work de Paur, and "No Bottom," Wolfe de Paur.

The final group of four selections will be concluded with "Ave Maria," by Bach and Gounod, with

special arrangements by de Paur. It is announced that each Community Concert membership card will be punched at the door by the ushers. To facilitate this practice, it is urged that each person hold his own card, rather than have one member of a group have the cards for all.

Plea Renewed To Halt Slot Machine Shipping

WASHINGTON.—(AP)—Attorney General McGrath renewed an urgent plea today that Congress prohibit interstate shipment of slot machines.

He told chairman Edwin C. Johnson of the Senate Interstate Commerce committee, in a letter McGrath made public that "with each passing day" the need for a law banning shipment of the one-armed bandits "becomes more apparent."

Both the House and Senate have passed such a bill, but in different forms. A compromise measure has been blocked by Senator Malone (R-Nev.), who talked against it for 11 hours last before Congress recessed last September.

GRASS CONTROL—A large gully on the Guy Hensley farm near Patton, once deep enough to hide a tractor, has now been brought so well under control it could be farmed.

Ward Schilling, operating the 280-acre farm, used reed canary grass to control the erosion. The grass had been doubling itself every year. Schilling says he doesn't plan to farm it, however, nor the surrounding upland. The upland has been eroding too severely to be cropped, he said. He will use the section for pasture. The grass which grows in clumps from two to eight feet in height, makes fine pasture and hay.
