

Timber Access Roads Urged By D. L. Goldy

PORTLAND — (AP) — Construction of timber access roads into isolated public lands — while there is manpower — was urged yesterday by the Federal Bureau of Land Management's regional director, Daniel L. Goldy, told the chamber of commerce members' forum that this would be stockpiling lumber "on the stump" for any national emergency.

He estimated the bureau's isolated lands hold eight billion board feet of over-ripe timber. He said the U. S. Forest service regional office estimates it could boost annual sales another billion feet if roads were built to isolated national forest tracts.

"If such a program is not carried out," Goldy said, "the present on presently accessible areas may result in irreparable damage to the resources during another war period."

Members of the board told four parents of band members that they consider a trip to Alaska unwise, especially in view of the international crisis.

A recent questionnaire showed that about 75 percent of band members' parents favor the trip, which has been a subject of controversy in Eugene.

Board members, in their action, indicated that parents supporting the planned trip must take responsibility for the tour, if they still wish to conduct it.

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Education Board Approves Two Appointments

PORTLAND — (AP) — Appointment of Howard R. Lemons, athletic business manager at the University of Oregon, as acting assistant to university President Harry Newburn, was approved here by the State Board of Higher Education.

Another assignment change, that of Fred Shideler to become director of Oregon State college news bureau, also was approved. He has been head of the department of journalism and will continue. John C. Burtner, who long headed the news bureau, has been ill for some time.

The board accepted a number of grants and gifts, the largest being \$25,000 from the U. S. Public Health service to extend the cancer training program at the medical school.

Among major bequests to Doernbecher children's hospital was one of \$5000 from the estate of Flora C. Hunter, The Dalles, and one of \$6000 from the estate of Elizabeth Fowler, Rogue River.

Other grants were for widely divergent purposes. The Northwest Chinchilla farms gave \$6000 for research into the proper diet for chinchillas. The State Liquor Control commission gave \$750 for research into drinking by college students. And the U. S. Brewers' foundation gave \$900 to continue research into hop production.

The board formally approved building plans at the University of Oregon for the school of business administration and social science departments and directed that final plans for a journalism building be drawn. It also approved increased board and room rates. That action was merely formal confirmation of the board's action as a committee Monday.

Chancellor Charles D. Byrne told board members that the number of faculty members in the higher education system holding advanced degrees was increasing substantially.

That academic training is not the only criterion of the caliber of the staff but it is "a major one and the most objective one," he said.

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Allies Unable To Stop War Goods Going To Russia

FRANKFURT — (AP) — Highly strategic war materials are flowing behind the Soviet Iron Curtain from West Germany, and the Western allies are powerless to stop them. Such crucial articles as machine tools, ball bearings, optical supplies steel tubing and raw steel are being moved secretly into the Soviet satellite bloc.

Allied officials believe that much or most of this material finds its way directly to Russia.

It is authoritatively believed also that quantities of rolling stock purchased from U. S. army surplus

has been deviously shipped to Soviet satellites for relay to Russia. The Western Allies find themselves helpless. They have export licensing power only over certain specific strategic materials. The rest are licensed by the West German government. It does not have the power or means to police the ultimate destination of purchased products.

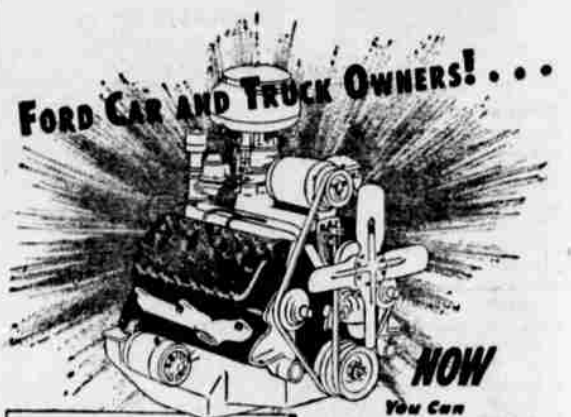
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
