Minstrel Show Proceeds To Aid Needy Families

Nearly 200 local people will combine their talents in the presentation of the Elks club's annual minstrel show Dec. 14, 15 and 16 at the junior high auditorium. Proceeds from the event are to be used to sponsor parties in Roseburg's three theaters Dec. 23 for the kiddies and to provide food baskets for needy families.

The show is directed by Robert Barrows of Geller productions, Hollywood. Scenery and costumes are by Geller.

Another performance, Dec. 13, is a special student show, which will get underway at 7:30. The other three shows start at 8 p.m. The first act of the two-act event is entitled "The Gay Nineties" and has 12 scenes, including singing waiters of the barber shop variety, and a full four-act old-fashioned melodrama called "Her Double Life, or The Curse of a Greedy Heart." Acts of the melodrama are interspersed with different song and dance routines. The acts are timed at one hour and 15 minutes each.

A full-stage chorus of 60 people take over in the second act and their part of the show is along traditional minstrel lines with blackface routines, songs, jokes and dances.

Bloodmobile's Visit To Douglas County Slated

The first visit of the Red Cross bloodmobile is scheduled for Douglas county on Jan. 23, it was announced today by Mrs. R. E. Herman, secretary of the local Red Cross chapter.

Two hundred pints of whole blood will be requested from Douglas county donors on this visit. In order to facilitate the collecting of this much whole blood for this and future visits of the bloodmobile, approximately 50 volunteer helpers will be needed, including eight Grey Ladies or hostesses, seven staff aides, (five must be typists) nine nurses or nurses' aides and six cantineers. Because of absenteeism or illness, it is necessary to have alternates trained to cover these positions.

A special meeting Monday, Dec. 18, at 3 p.m., will make plans for the bloodmobile visit. The Red Cross board members, representatives from local hospitals and the medical association will be present. Local residents who are interested in the program are also invited to attend. "In view of the urgent demand for whole blood, the recruitment of volunteer assistants for the bloodmobile visit is essential," said Mrs. Herman.

Emergency U.S. Capital Urged By Congressman

WASHINGTON — (AP) — An emergency capital should be established somewhere in the interior of the nation with underground communications and water supply, Rep. Wint Smith (R-Kans.) says. He said a supply of underground water is necessary so the emergency capital's sources would not be contaminated by a possible storm bomb explosion. "When we disperse government agencies, I want them to have underground communication, which is a most necessary thing in time of any emergency," Smith told a reporter.

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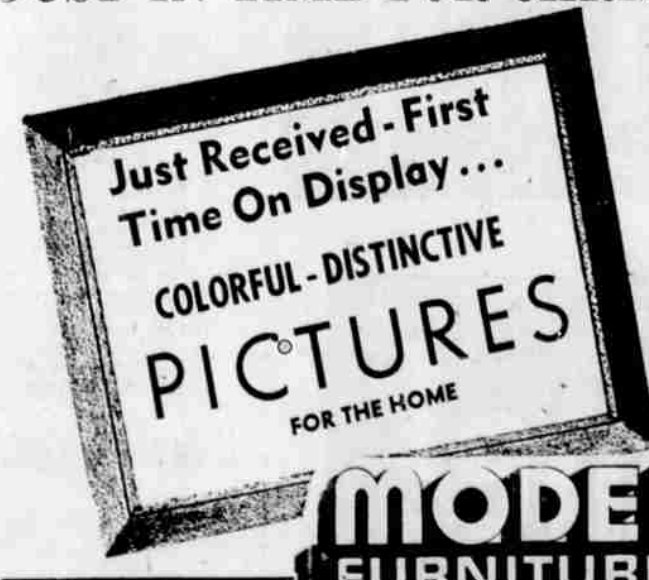
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
