President Syngman Rhee told the assembly the Allies "will win the victory in Korea despite temporary reversities."
He reaffirmed his government's intent to fight "to the last man to the end" against communism.

"Our situation is certainly no worse than that which we faced last July when we were outnumbered and out-gunned by a North Korean Communist foe," Rhee said. "In fact we are much better off."

Adultery Time-Limit Set In British Divorce Case

LONDON — (AP)—The House of Lords has ruled that a man whose wife had a baby 360 days after the last time he saw her is entitled to a divorce on grounds of adultery.

The plaintiff was Charles P. Jones, a veteran of the Royal Air Force. His wife, Bertha, had the baby on August 13, 1946. Although Jones proved he had not visited her since Aug. 18, 1945, she insisted the baby was his.

A lower court upheld Mrs. Jones and refused her husband's plea for a divorce.

Granting Jones' appeal, the House of Lords' legal panel noted various courts have held in the past that births after periods of 331, 346 and even 349 days "were not impossible," but added:

"It would appear a fantastic suggestion to any ordinary man or woman that a normal child could be born 360 days after the last intercourse."

Violent Earthquake Felt In Northeast California

SAN FRANCISCO — (AP)—An earthquake described as violent by residents was felt in the isolated Donner summit area of the Sierra at 5:25 a.m. today.

Civil Aeronautics authority said the CAA Airways station there was shaken violently.

There was no report of damage, however.

The quake was felt mildly as far as Sacramento, Calif., to the west and Reno, Nev., to the east.

Donner summit is about 160 miles northeast of San Francisco.

The University of California seismograph registered the quake for 30 minutes.

Ex-Bank Official Likely To Be Freed Of Larceny

SEATTLE — (AP)—A former Seattle bank executive who fled after embezzling \$8,500 and returned 14 years later to make restitution may have grand larceny charges against him dismissed as a Christmas present.

Such a request has been made by the parole board in the state in which the ex-banker, Allan Paul Hull, now lives, it was learned today.

Hull, now 60, took \$8,500 from the Tower Savings bank, of which he was executive vice president, in 1935 and disappeared. He returned here in October, 1949, surrendered and repaid the money.

Sentencing of the grand larceny charges was deferred for three years on condition that he serve six months in the county jail.

When released last April, Hull was permitted to leave the state, reporting monthly to the Washington state board of prison terms and paroles through the parole board in the state where he now lives.

A court order has kept these reports and Hull's present whereabouts a secret.

Superior Judge Chester A. Batchelor said the request for dismissal of the grand larceny charges would be considered some time next week.

The judge said Hull has submitted an affidavit changing his plea of guilty to one of innocent, thus clearing the way for dismissal of the charge should the recommendation be accepted.

Republicans Working On Foreign Policy Stand

WASHINGTON — (AP)—A four-man senate Republican policy subcommittee decided to make a last-ditch effort today to agree on a foreign policy declaration for the Republicans.

The fourth meeting for the group, set up a week ago to draft a foreign policy statement for presentation to the Senate's 43 GOP lawmakers, appeared to have only a 50-50 chance of ending in any agreement.

The heart of the problem appeared to be whether senate Republicans, as a party, should formally declare they have no confidence in Secretary of State Acheson and demand that President Truman fire him.

Allies Will Drive Reds From Korea, Seoul Meet Told

SEOUL — (AP)—Harold J. Noble, first secretary of the American embassy, told the war weary people of Seoul today he is convinced the Allies will launch a counterattack to drive the Communists out of Korea.

"I am convinced that the United Nations forces in Korea, fighting with Republic of Korea forces, will not yield one more inch of territory to the enemy," Noble told 40,000 persons at a general armament rally.

Noble added: "The establishment of a free and united Korea remains the basic aim of the United States government, just as much now as in the past. The United States' aims, objectives and determination have not changed in the slightest."
