Portland Defense Plan Needs Funds For Signs
 PORTLAND — (AP) — Portland's air raid shelters will be marked as soon as someone finds out how to pay for the signs.
 By that time, it is assumed the location of the shelters will be known.
 Mayor Dorothy Lee suggested to the civil defense advisory board that perhaps owners of the buildings designated as shelters would pay for the signs.
 A survey of 83 buildings in the downtown area, to determine their fitness as shelters, will be completed Dec. 22. Then 65 public schools will be surveyed and after that the parochial schools will be checked. About 250 engineers are working with city building department staff in making the survey.
 The west side warden system will require 12,000 volunteer workers. Mrs. Joseph Minott reported to the advisory board.

Portland Teachers Ask Annual Salary Boost
 PORTLAND — (AP) — Portland's school teachers want a \$400 annual salary increase.
 It would cost the district about \$900,000 annually, Clarence E. Oliver, chairman of the school employees' salary co-ordinating committee, estimated. Supt. Paul A. Rehms said that estimate was about right.
 Although the district doesn't have enough money to pay the increase, Oliver told the board the teachers want the increase approved anyway. If that isn't done, he said, teachers' pay might be caught in a federal wage freeze.
 If the board approved the increase, the voters would have to O.K. a special tax levy to make it effective.
 Oliver said the present median salary of \$3600 in Portland is worth \$1700 in terms of 1939 dollars.

Moscow Lie Ament Japanese "Army" Denounced
 WASHINGTON — (AP) — The State department has denounced as a "naked lie" a Moscow claim that the United States and Japan have taken the first steps to rebuild the Japanese army.
 The department, in a bristling statement, said it looks as though the communist propaganda machine is possibly preparing the way to put into effect the new alliance between Russia and Communist China.
 Under terms of a Moscow treaty, Russia and Red China have pledged joint military action against aggression by Japan or any power allied with Japan.
 The department's statement was aimed at a Soviet Tass news agency dispatch datelined Shanghai and published in the Moscow newspaper Pravda. Russia also has made the charge that the United States is rearming Japan in formal protests submitted to the 13-nation Far Eastern commission.

Lumber Profit Report Shows Big Sales in U.S.
 VANCOUVER, B. C. — (CP) — The H. R. MacMillan Export Co. Ltd., largest forest operator in British Columbia, had a net profit of \$7,412,381 for the year ending Sept. 30, it was announced.
 It was \$1,640,778 higher than a year ago, but less than the 1948 peak year profit of \$8,484,839.
 Higher production costs and lower prices for lumber accounted for the drop from 1948, the annual report showed.
 Gross income was \$89,738, the greatest in the company's history. It topped the previous high in 1948 by \$9,279,576. The gross total was \$75,888,184.
 Sales in the United States during the 1949 year totalled \$31,600,000, nearly double the 1949 figure of \$16,795,000.
THE AGE OF SMOKE
 BONN, Germany — (AP) — At what age should youngsters be allowed to smoke? Grown-ups in this country are just as wisely split on the issue as anywhere else.
 Now the lawmakers of this young republic have made an energetic dash at it. What they wanted to decide was this: at what age may youngsters be allowed to smoke "in public?" After ten months of deliberation they emerged with a draft of a new "youth protection law" to reduce age limit from 15 to 16 years.
