Air Force-Army Teamwork Can Save Western Europe, General Vandenberg Says

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Congress has air General Hoyt Vandenberg's word that strategic bombing can help an outnumbered land army save Western Europe from an aggressor.

The air force's chief of staff reaffirmed his confidence in strategic air war (the destruction of an enemy's munitions-producing centers) in his most recent Capitol Hill appearance to testify on new military appropriations requests.

The value of strategic air war has been debated for a decade, since the first days of World War II. Strategic air war now is one of the major components of the defensive war plans of the American joint chiefs of staff, of which Vandenberg is a member.

Vandenberg summed up the air force's views about air power in grand strategy, saying this: "Korea can't be taken as an example because in that war zone there is an 'inviolate border' and you can't use strategic air in full measure." The border is the Yalu river, beyond which lie the air bases and assembling points for the masses of Chinese Red troops which have overwhelmed United Nations ground forces. Under questioning, Vandenberg said the Yalu boundary was made inviolate by decision of the United Nations.

"But if we are now talking about Europe, where there are no borders that we cannot cross," he said. And here Vandenberg diplomatically referred to "X nation" as the aggressor. He continued:

Victory Reason Told

"The theory the air force does not believe that the war can be won solely by the navy or solely by the air force or solely by the army is this:

"Let us take, for example X country which has overwhelming ground forces. We do not put the ground forces in the field, but we put in a tremendous strategic air force. Let us take X country that is relatively poor in its manufacturing capacity. Let us say that the air force succeeds in knocking out its potential to fight a war. Now the army of this X country is at least smart enough to know that air potential exists and, as every army does, it stockpiles behind its lines on enough for a certain period of time. We knock out the entire supporting industry of that army.

"It picks up its stockpile and it moves into a country that has a better and more modern facility for producing war material than the country we have destroyed and that army imposes its civilization upon the overrun country. Obviously, the air force then cannot have succeeded in its task of preventing this new country from being overrun.

Team Work Required

"On the other hand, let us suppose that this movement (by X's ground force) into a defensive line is such that a smaller number of ground forces are going to oppose this great mass of X army. The reason we want a number of ground forces opposing this great mass of X army is to force them, before they can overrun the

Boy, Ignorant Of Family Tragedy, Faces Happy Yule

ALTOONA, Pa. — (AP) — Tommy Ebbert is going to have a wonderful Christmas before he hears about the greatest tragedy of his life.

The plucky 11-year-old is recovering in Mercy hospital from serious burns. He's kept happy by all the visitors, gifts and attention he gets.

Tommy doesn't know his mother, brother, three sisters and grandfather burned to death in the fire that sent him to the hospital.

He thinks they do not visit him because they have no way of getting the 10 miles into town from their house which no longer exists.

Tommy and his father, William Ebbert, are the only survivors of the fire. The father, in another ward of the hospital, said:

"Tommy's not to know about the others until after Christmas."

Letters and telegrams from well wishers and offers of aid are pouring from folks who read Tommy's story in newspapers or heard it on the radio.

Tommy asked for a toy train for Christmas. The Lionel company is providing one.

A fund has been established to take care of monetary gifts. Pennsylvania railroad workers in this bustling railroad town are passing the hat. One youngster sent Tommy a Christmas card with a nickel and three pennies enclosed.

A drug manufacturer offered to provide the hospital with free medicine for Tommy.

"Gee whiz," the youngster told a nurse. "I've got so many friends!"
