Bridges' Pal, Schmidt, Barred From Defense Job

SAN FRANCISCO — (AP) — An army spokesman declared here that Henry Schmidt, long a top officer in the Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's union won't be permitted to work at any military establishment in the area. Schmidt first was barred at the naval supply center at Oakland, security officials there said. The army and navy said only men considered good security risks will be accepted for work at any military operation, including the Oakland supply depot. Schmidt was a co-defendant with Harry Bridges, president of the left-wing union, in the trial which resulted in Bridges' conviction of perjury. He was sentenced to five years in prison and has appeared. Schmidt was sentenced two years for conspiracy.

Schmidt showed up at the naval base with a crew of longshoremen Tuesday. He worked 2 1/2 hours before he was summoned to the administration building. "We don't want you around," he was told. He was the first person to be barred from working on bay area waterfronts, in line with the new stringent security regulations. **SLIPS ON SLIP** LONG BEACH, Calif. — (AP) — "This is the start of our joint bank account," the bridegroom told the teller. Death Sentence Reversal Followed By Repeat Deed

ANCHORAGE, Alaska — (AP) — A 22-year-old soldier, whose death sentence for the rape slaying of an Anchorage woman was reversed only two weeks ago, was sentenced Tuesday to 15 years in the federal penitentiary on a charge of assaulting a second woman with intent to commit rape.

The soldier, Harvey L. Carignan, was sentenced to McNeil island prison for the attempted rape of Mrs. Christine Norton of Anchorage in July, 1949.

It was after his arrest in connection with the attack on Mrs. Norton that Carignan confessed to the slaying of Mrs. Laura Shalwaller.

A death sentence followed his conviction of the murder and rape charges, but was reversed by the U. S. Ninth circuit court of appeals two weeks ago. The court held that

his conviction of the crime, obtained by what defense attorneys contended was "psychological intimidation," should not have been admitted in the trial. A new trial on the charges was ordered.

Carignan was to have left here by plane Tuesday for the Puget Sound penitentiary.

SAN FRANCISCO — (AP) — In a honeymoon mood, Shirley Temple declared Wednesday she has made her last motion picture, she has definitely retired from films and "I have signed a new contract — with Charles — the only contract I have."

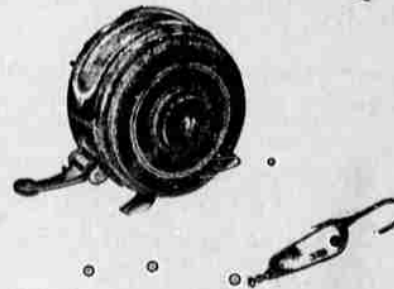
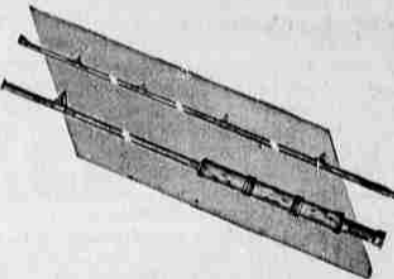
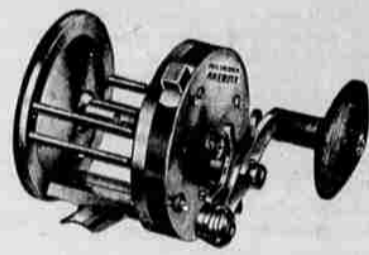
