**Seed Ripening By Chemicals Seen Probable**

PORTLAND — (AP) — Chemicals may soon replace the sun to ripen farmers' seed crops.

Revolutionary methods of defoliating crops to speed and thus regulate ripening were outlined by J. R. Mc Cambridge, Chipman Chemical company scientist, who spoke to 600 farmers at the Oregon Seed Growers league meeting here.

Mc Cambridge said the chemicals are called defoliants — for lack of a better name — and would help eliminate losses caused by weather interference with harvest operations.

He said the spraying of liquids containing dinitro general and pentachloronitro have been used by cotton growers. There they cause leaf fall. In seed crops, such as wheat, they cause leaf drop, as were used in Oregon tests in 1949; the chemical action forces drying. This speeds maturity of the plant and the seed. Costs of the chemicals and aerial application run \$8.50 to \$6.75 an acre.

The scholar said results so far indicate germination of the seeds so harvested is not affected, nor is the feeding value of the straw. It doesn't appear to thin seed crop stands, either, he added.

Mc Cambridge said farmers should "go easy" on use because defoliants are tricky and may easily cause crop damage. But, he said, their use has tremendous possibilities in agriculture.

Employment of a researcher in seeds at the Eastern Oregon experiment station at Union; improvement of market reporting on small seeds; opposition to an alta fescue seed price support program in 1951; appointment of a committee to seek more uniform seed laws with other states.
