U.S. Casualties In Korea 38,325

WASHINGTON — (AP) — A announced U. S. casualties in the Korean war rose to 38,325 through midnight Dec. 22, an increase of 1,904 over the cumulative total reported in the previous week.

The department of defense, in releasing the figures today, emphasized that they represent only the number of notifications sent to next of kin and do not reflect all casualties suffered through Dec. 22.

The total included 6,432 deaths, of these, 5,742 were killed in action, 684 died of wounds and 6 deaths were recorded among men who had been reported missing in action.

The wounded total was 27,042, including those who later died of wounds.

The missing figure reached 5,771 since the beginning of hostilities. Of this number 4,733 are listed as currently missing. In addition to the six missing who were listed today as having died, this total includes 705 who have since returned to U. S. military control and 107 known prisoners of war.

Total army casualties reached 32,066. The navy total was 429, the air force 306 and marine corps casualties reached 5,524.

Funeral services for William R. Van Blaricom, 59, who was accidentally killed when struck by a car in Bremerton Wash. Dec. 25 will be held in The Chapel of The Saturday Dec. 30 at 11 a. m. with the Revs. Rae Kleinfeldt and Kenneth Knox officiating.

Mr. Van Blaricom was born August 12 1891 in Cincinnati Iowa and came to Roseburg nine years ago to make his home. He was an employee of the Umpqua Plywood Company at the time of his death. He was a member of the First Christian church of Roseburg and of the Plywood and Veneer Workers union No. 9-436.

Surviving are the widow Florence Roseburg; a daughter, Mrs. Creta Williams, Bremerton, Wash.; his mother Mrs. Lucy Van Blaricom, Cincinnati Iowa; six brothers and two sisters all of Cincinnati Iowa; and two grandsons, Allen and Roger Williams, both of Bremerton.

Interment will follow in the Masonic cemetery.

New Security Regulations Screen Subversives From U.S. Maritime Workers

WASHINGTON — (AP) — The coast guard has laid down new port and ship security rules designed to screen subversives from the ranks of the nation's maritime workers.

The security regulations were ordered into immediate effect by coast guard commander Merlin O'Neill. He acted in the face of a strike threat at West coast ports, the embarkation point for men and supplies to Korea.

Heads of two unions—both expelled from the CIO this year on charges of following the Communist party program—threatened a strike at coast guard hearings a month ago unless the then-proposed regulations were changed to suit them.

The final regulations put out by Admiral O'Neill differ in many respects from the initial proposals, but whether the changes go far enough to kill the danger of a strike could not be determined immediately.

The strike-threatening union heads were Harry Bridges of the 70,000-member International Longshoremen's Association (ILA) and Hugh Bryson Jr., of the 10,000-member Marine Cooks and Stewards Union. Both unions are chiefly active on the west coast.

"Security Card" At Issue

Bridges and Bryson centered much of their fire on a proposal to empower the coast guard to require the "security card" to be required for employment on U. S. vessels or waterfront facilities. This would have allowed denial of a card to a worker.

"When reasonable grounds are found to warrant the belief that such person is affiliated with, or sympathetic to, any organization, group or combination of persons subversive or disloyal to the government of the United States,"

That provision was rewritten extensively in the final regulations. The two union chiefs claim that such charges are too vague and no man could defend himself against them. They contended that security card denials should apply only to persons convicted of or proved to be trained for spying or sabotage.

As put into effect by O'Neill, the provision now reads that the basis of card denials shall be "reasonable grounds for the belief that the individual:

1. Has committed acts of treason or sedition, or has engaged in acts of espionage or sabotage, or has actively advocated or aided the commission of such acts by others; or has knowingly associated with persons committing such acts; or—
2. Is employed by, or subject to the influence of, a foreign government, which may jeopardize the security interests of the United States; or—
3. Has actively advocated or supported the overthrow of the government of the United States by the use of force or violence; or—
4. Has intentionally disclosed military information, classified confidential or higher without authority and with reasonable knowledge or belief that it may be transmitted to a foreign government, or has intentionally disclosed such information to persons not authorized to receive it; or—
5.
