NEW YORK — (A) — A teachers wage dispute has virtually paralyzed public high school sports in his second largest city in the world idling more than 10,000 scholastic stilletias. athleties.

In this city of 8,000,000 people, only six schoolboy football teams played abbreviated schedules inst fall. Only three of 60 high schools which normally have baskerball teams are trying to go through with a court schedule.
