Civil Rights Plan Dead Duck, View Of Congressmen

WASHINGTON — (AP) — President Truman's renewed recommendation for legislation to protect the civil rights of minority groups got no encouragement in capitol hill.
Most lawmakers, even those friendly to some other portions of Mr. Truman's "Fair Deal" program, considered civil rights a dead duck as a practical matter in this Congress.
In his budget message, the President once more urged Congress to create a federal fair employment practices commission (FEPC) to prevent job discrimination in interstate industries. He told Congress: "Even less than in other times can we now afford to discriminate in employment against the millions of workers in our labor force who are members of minority groups."
Republicans, accusing the President of pushing for his "Fair Deal" under the guise of national security, lumped FEPC with other social and welfare proposals into "the same old tired socialist program" which Mr. Truman has sought before.
Southern Democrats solidly oppose the FEPC, and with Republicans they dominate the house

Truman Defense Budget Elates Western Europe

LONDON — (AP) — Applause tinged with amazement marked the reception in western Europe of President Truman's new budget and its vast outlay for defense.
London's liberal Star said the military spending figures "are so colossal that the mind is stunned by the very accumulation of digits." It added:
"The two facts which should be remembered about this biggest of

Only after a bitter behind-the-scenes fight did an FEPC bill come to the House floor in the last Congress. Then, a Dixie-GOP coalition eliminated its penalty provisions and sent a watered down measure to the Senate, where the threat of a filibuster killed it.

All peace-time budgets are that the money must be found by the American taxpayer, and that at a word from Stalin it need never be spent at all."
A spokesman for the French foreign office called the budget "another assurance, if one were needed, that the United States is preparing to defend itself and help defend the rest of the world."
"It is cheering," the spokesman told reporters, "to see that the President has asked for this huge amount, because it shows the determination with which the American government is shouldering its burden of preparation for all eventualities."
The liberal Dagens Nyheter of Stockholm described the budget message as the "strongest imaginable warning to the men in the Kremlin not to plunge the world into a new war which would... bring the end of their own regime."
It is proof, the newspaper said, that America is ready "to make the greatest sacrifice side by side with the other western democracies to win a swift victory in this war, if it ever comes."

Tax Filing Aides Dated In Douglas Cities

Hugh H. Earle, Oregon district collector of internal revenue announced this week that tax aides will visit seven Douglas county cities between Jan. 23 and March 15, to assist taxpayers in preparing federal income tax returns.
The cities and visiting dates are: Reedsport, city hall, Feb. 28; Sutherlin, Sutherland hotel, Feb. 26; Myrtle Creek, city hall, Feb. 5; Drain, city recorder's office, Feb. 16; Oakland, Oakland bank, Feb. 27; Glendale, city hall, Feb. 19 and 20, and Roseburg, Pacific building, Feb. 28 to March 15.

Slovak Bishops Get Prison Terms

PRAGUE, Czechoslovakia — (AP) — Two Slovak bishops were sentenced to life imprisonment Monday for crimes against the Czechoslovak state.
They were Bishop Gajdick, 62, Greek Catholic primate of Czechoslovakia, and Bishop Michael Buzalka, 65, a Roman Catholic prelate.
Another Roman Catholic prelate, Bishop Jan Vojtassak, 73, was sentenced to 24 years imprisonment.
The three bishops have been on trial since Wednesday on charges of high treason and espionage against the Communist-led regime.

Arctic Warfare Topic Of Armory Address Tonight

That American soldiers can fight effectively in the Arctic will be demonstrated by Capt. Bernard Nagelmann, USA, in his two-hour illustrated lecture, "Arctic Warfare," to members of the organized reserve corps at the armory in Roseburg tonight. Also invited to attend are members of the national guard and reserve officers training corps.
Captain Nagelmann will discuss Arctic warfare of the future and the solution of its problems. He will discuss the advantages and disadvantages of the Arctic regions for military operations and demonstrate and explain equipment and techniques designed to reduce the disadvantages of Arctic climate and terrain.
One of eight Sixth army officers presently touring the eight states of the army area, Capt. Nagelmann will also exhibit several types of Arctic equipment, including the three types of footwear: mukluks, shoe pacs and felt boots; fiberglass and pile-lined parkas, trousers, field caps and socks.
He will point out that Arctic conditions actually extend deep into the United States, particularly Wyoming, Montana, North Dakota, other northern states and even into Colorado.

They also were accused of helping the Germans during World War II.
In addition, Bishops Buzalka and Vojtassak were charged with plotting against the republic in the prewar period.
Newspaper and radio reports said all three confessed on the witness stand that they had supported a separate Slovak state set up in March, 1939, as an ally of Germany.
Nine Catholic Czech clergymen were sentenced last month to terms ranging from 10 years to life in a similar case.
Bishop Vojtassak was fined 500,000 crowns (\$10,000) and the other two 200,000 crowns (\$4,000) each. All property of the three men is confiscated.

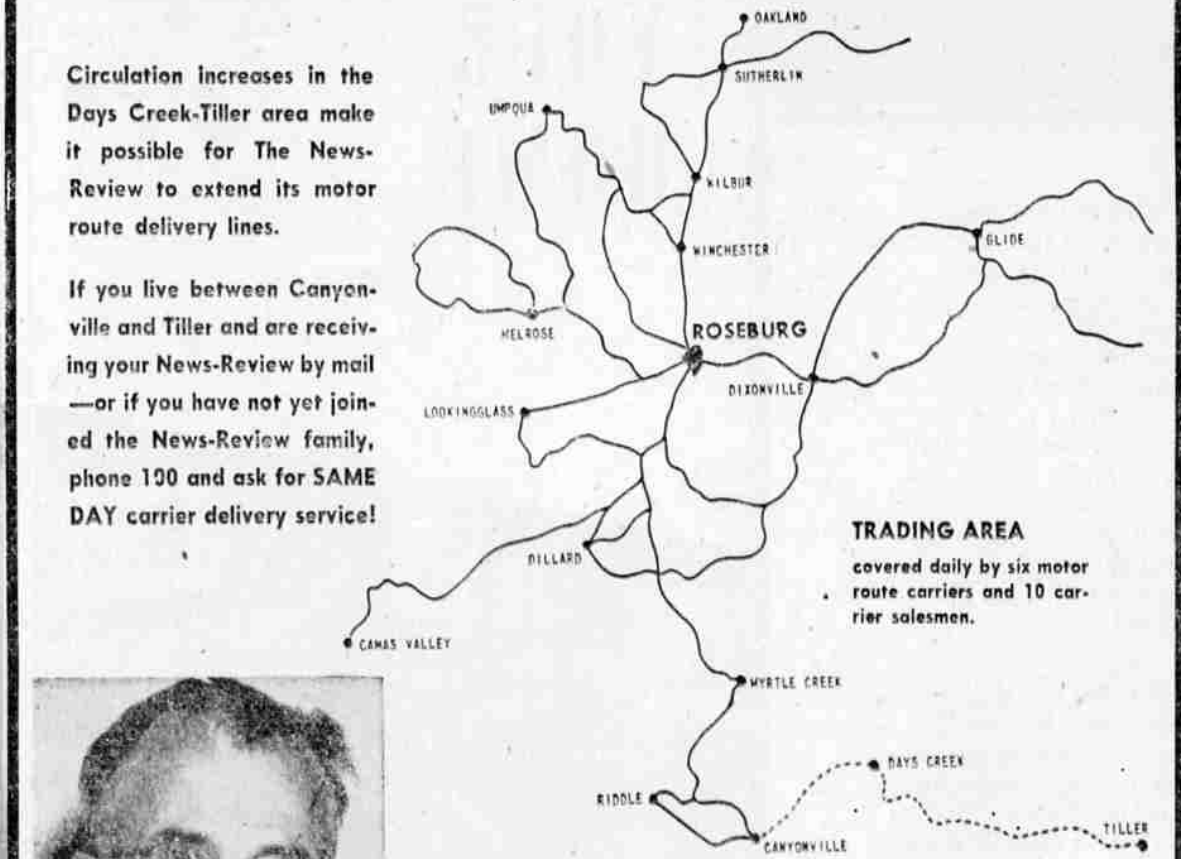
