U.S. Air Force Capable Of Quick Action, Chief Says

TOKYO — (AP)—Gen. Hoyt S. Vandenberg said here the air forces likely would be able to strike back quickly against any unheralded air assault against the United States mainland.

He explained that a long-range air attack "cannot be launched instantly." He was asked if the United States, being a democracy, likely would not be hit a surprise air attack if a communist enemy undertook direct assault on the United States.

The 52-year-old general then asked correspondents if they wanted him to go on and expand that cryptic two-word answer. Vandenberg said it was an air force maxim that offense was the best defense.

"The whole proof of defense against an enemy power is action and destruction on the other end," Vandenberg said. "The American strategic air force is small but very efficient."

He said the so-called "radar fence" guarding air approach to the United States was just going in. He contended there was a point of diminishing returns in spending for air defense and interceptors.

At Britain's best in the air "outfit for Britain," the British never knocked down more than eight percent of raiding German bombers. The Germans never were able to knock down more than four percent.

Members of the State Game department and the U. S. Forest service met jointly at Medford Tuesday to discuss problems of fish and game management with particular emphasis on the forest service timber disposal program as it affects the fish and game habitat.

Another State Hospital Sought By Legislators

SALEM — (AP)—A new state hospital, primarily for aged mental patients, would be built in the Portland area under a bill introduced by 18 legislators.

The bill would be referred to the people at the next general or special election, because the constitution says no institution can be located outside of Marion county without approval by the people.

The hospital would be located within 15 miles of the Multnomah county courthouse. If the legislature and the people vote for it, the hospital would be built by the board of control.

Oregon now has two state hospitals. They are located at Salem and Pendleton. Reapportionment Study Asked. A legislative interim committee is studying reapportionment of the state's four congressional districts.

The eight-man committee would hold hearings over the state, and would report to the 1953 legislature. Neuberger said Oregon's congressional districts are badly out of balance, and that the population of the districts should be made more equal.

He gave the following population figures for each district: 1st (Northwest Oregon) 432,448. 2nd (Eastern Oregon) 245,976. 3rd (Multnomah county) 468,371. and 4th (Southwest Oregon) 385,105.

Bills to Give Leaves of Absence to Public Employees who Fight in United Nations police actions were introduced by the house military affairs committee. It also introduced a measure to give the American U. N. soldiers the same civil service job preferences that are given other veterans.

These measures will apply to veterans of the Korean war, as well as to any future United Nations action. The committee also sponsored bills to increase to \$2,500 the property tax exemption which is given to veterans who are 40 percent disabled and to veterans' widows.

Worst Polio Victim Begins Dimes March

WYTHEVILLE, Va. — (AP)—The 1931 March of Dimes was launched last night in this small town that suffered the nation's worst polio epidemic last year. Basil O'Connor, president of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, warned in a coast-to-coast broadcast that "poliomyelitis is on the increase in America."

Calling for \$50,000,000 in new funds, O'Connor said the foundation had a \$5,000,000 debt at the end of 1950 because of three successive epidemic years. He said that speaking from Wytheville was like talking from "the very bedside of a friend."

The March of Dimes campaign lasts through this month. WASHINGTON — (AP)—The dean of theology at Catholic university, where boxing is an outstanding sport, says it may be contrary to Catholic teaching. Writing in the February issue of "Catholic Men," the Rev. Francis J. Connell suggested that ring rules be changed so that the object is "giving and parrying light blows, not with the intention of injuring the opponent but merely with the purpose of outwitting him in skill, agility and ingenuity."

The theologian said "the fifth commandment, as interpreted by the Catholic church, forbids not only murder, but also the inflicting of bodily injury on a fellow man."
