They are medical men trained at government expense but who have had less than 90 days active service.

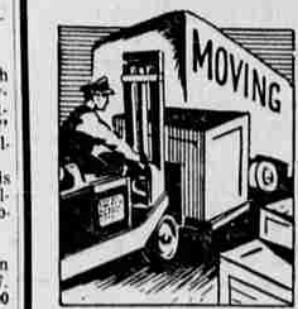
### TWO WILLS IN PROBATE

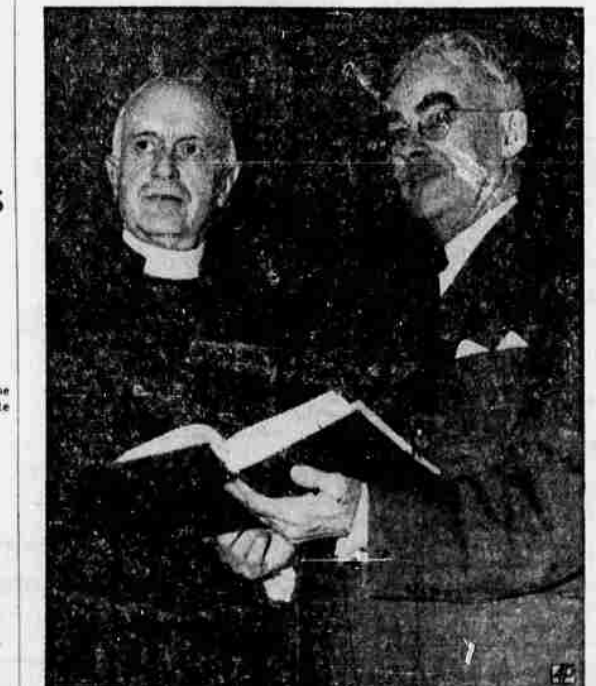
### Fire In Army Repair Shop Claims One Life

ANCHORAGE, Alaska — (AP) — A serviceman was killed Tuesday in a fast-spreading fire which destroyed a heavy repair shop at Fort Richardson.

Damages to the year-old two-story concrete structure were estimated at \$500,000. Several army vehicles were also believed lost in the fire.

The name of the victim was withheld pending notification of relatives.

The building was used by the army engineers for maintenance of their heavy equipment.
