### Pat Turner Wins Toastmasters' Speech Contest

A gray-haired, silver-tongued orator named Pat Turner will represent the Roseburg Toastmasters club in the organization's area speech contest to be held later this spring.

Turner won the honor Tuesday evening in the local club's "speaker of the year" contest, with a fiery talk entitled, "The Price of Freedom." He declared that loyalty to both country and mankind was the price that the peoples of free nations must pay to maintain their freedoms.

Turner described patriotism as consisting of three elements, love, sacrifice and beauty.

Mickey Hard, speaking on the subject, "An American Appeal" placed second in the contest and will serve as an alternative for Turner.

Hard urged his packed audience of Toastmasters, Toastmistresses and guests to improve their state mental hospitals. He said the condition of some of the state mental hospitals in the U.S. were so terrible they were "beyond description." He said it was up to the

Bob Harvie, the third contestant in the competition, spoke on the menace of speeding motorists to traffic safety. He urged the adoption of a national speed control program for highway safety.

Bob Walker, the final contestant, delivered a biographical sketch of Abraham Lincoln.

The speakers were judged by four Toastmasters on a point basis.

The contest was preceded by the regular Toastmaster dinner and program. Ed Drysdale spoke on the importance and organization of the Boy Scouts. Walt Ackley described some of the features of the Oregon Financial Responsibility act of 1943.

Keith Phillips lead the "Table Topics discussion on the subject, "Accommodating Acts."

Tom Coates acted as Toastmaster for both the speech contest and the regular meeting.

**Girl's Self-Strangling Blamed on Coning**

GRANVILLE FERRY, Nov. 4 (AP) — A comic book picturization of a girl held captive was believed responsible for the self-strangling of 11-year-old Evelyn Halliday.

The child was found dead in her bedroom, apparently after she tied herself to the bedpost in imitation of the captive portrayed in a comic book at her feet. A coroner's jury, including a newstand vendor of such publications, recommended in its verdict of accidental death that such "type of comic book be banned."
