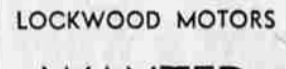

In a ceremony this provincial capital, Cushman told Premier John M. Chang: "On behalf of the members of people of Passaic, N. J., I, acting through the instrumentality of the Marine League of America, as representative of the First marine air wing, make a gift to you of these clothes and toys for the use of Korean refugees and orphans."

National Forest Timber For Sale

Oral auction will be received by the Forest Supervisor, Post Office Building, Roseburg, Oregon, beginning at 2:00 p.m., Pacific Standard Time, March 20, 1951, for all the live timber market or designated dead timber located on an area embracing about 110 acres within sections 10 and 11, T. 29 S., R. 1 E., W. M., Umpqua National Forest, estimated to be 1,400,000 feet B. M. more or less of Douglas-fir, 12,000 feet B. M. more or less of sugar pine, 140,000 feet B. M. more or less of ponderosa pine, 200,000 feet B. M. more or less of California incense-cedar, 1,000 feet B. M. more or less of western redcedar, 75,000 feet B. M. more or less of white fir, 2,000 feet B. M. more or less of western hemlock, and 1,000 feet B. M. more or less of western white pine. No bid of less than \$5.10 per M feet for Douglas-fir, \$6.60 per M feet for sugar pine, \$6.60 per M feet for ponderosa pine, \$3.55 per M feet for California incense-cedar, \$3.55 per M feet for Western redcedar, \$3.55 per M feet for white fir, \$3.55 per M feet for western hemlock, and \$6.60 per M feet for western white pine will be considered. In addition to prices bid for stumpage a cooperative deposit of \$0.30 per M feet B. M. to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of that part of the slash not required to be performed by the purchaser and a cooperative deposit of \$0.65 per M feet B. M. to cover the cost of tree planting and seedling and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over for the total cut of sawtimber under the terms of the agreement will be required. As a qualification for oral bidding all bidders must submit a sealed bid accompanied by the required payment to the Forest Supervisor prior to 2:00 p.m., Pacific Standard Time, March 20, 1951. The maximum acceptable bids in accordance with General Ceiling Price Regulation of January 26, 1951, are \$62.35 per M bd. ft. for Douglas-fir, \$42.40 per M bd. ft. for sugar pine, \$51.65 per M bd. ft. for ponderosa pine, \$7.95 per M bd. ft. for California incense-cedar, \$34.75 per M bd. ft. for western redcedar, \$14.50 per M bd. ft. for white fir, \$20.85 per M bd. ft. for western hemlock, and \$42.20 per M bd. ft. for western white pine. Bids in excess of these amounts will be reduced to ceiling prices before determination of the highest bid is made. Sealed bids will be posted at the beginning of the auction for the information of all bidders. \$2,000.00 must accompany each bid, to be refunded on the purchase price, to be applied or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to the conditions of sale. If an oral bid is declared to be high at the closing of the auction, the bidder must immediately confirm the oral bid by submitting it in writing on a Forest Service bid form. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Forest Service bid forms for use in submitting sealed bids and full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale and the submission of bids should be obtained from the District Ranger, Tiller, Oregon, or the Forest Supervisor, Roseburg, Oregon, before bids are submitted.

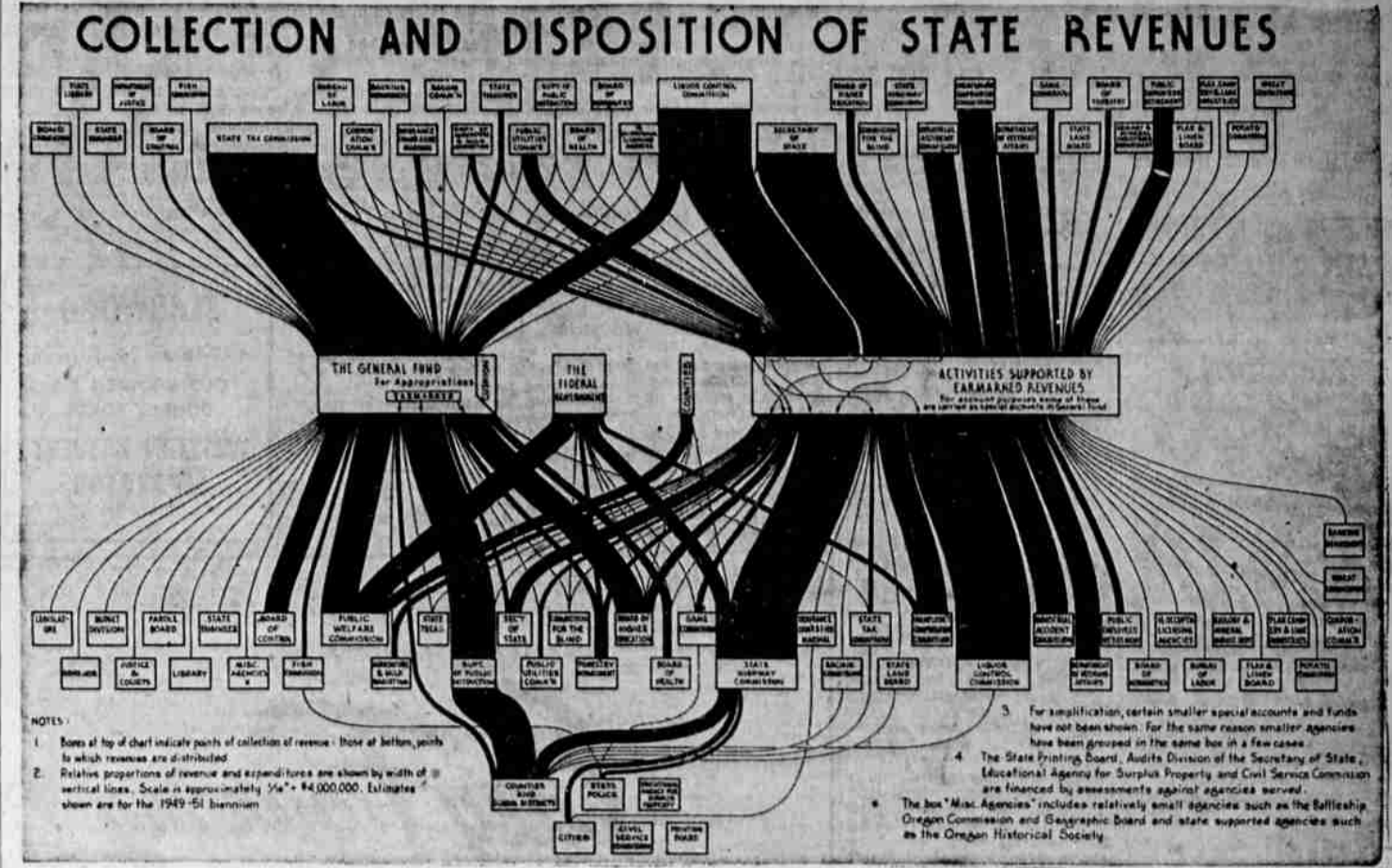

Pictured above is the flow of state revenue and expenditures as shown in the report presented to the Oregon Legislature by the interim committee on state government administration. At the top of the chart are some 40 different state agencies whose primary responsibility is tax administration and collection. Important revenue collections of various types comprise an important phase of the activities of a large number of other state agencies, however. "The large number and variety of revenue producing methods, complicated further by relations of intergovernmental tax relationships, have resulted in a system which few understand and which makes sound public control of both taxation and governmental spending more difficult to achieve and which adds to administrative costs and problems." Discussing the practice of earmarking revenues in the financing of state activities, the committee indicated that some of this was necessary—such as special trust funds—but the general application of the practice tended to weaken budgetary control and to make for a rigidity which hampered prudent methods for balancing costs in financing state government services.
