**Red Cross Offers Course in Bomb Victims' Care**

WASHINGTON — (AP) — The Red Cross has prepared a quick course in emergency care of bombing victims, including those of atomic attack, and has urged its chapters all across the nation to help with a mass training program.

The course lists burns and wounds as the most common casualties and says that contrary to popular belief "radioactive damage would be relatively minor."

In another move, the civil defense organization said its film, "Survival Under Atomic Attack," will be ready for public release in March. The film parallels a booklet with the same title, already released.
