

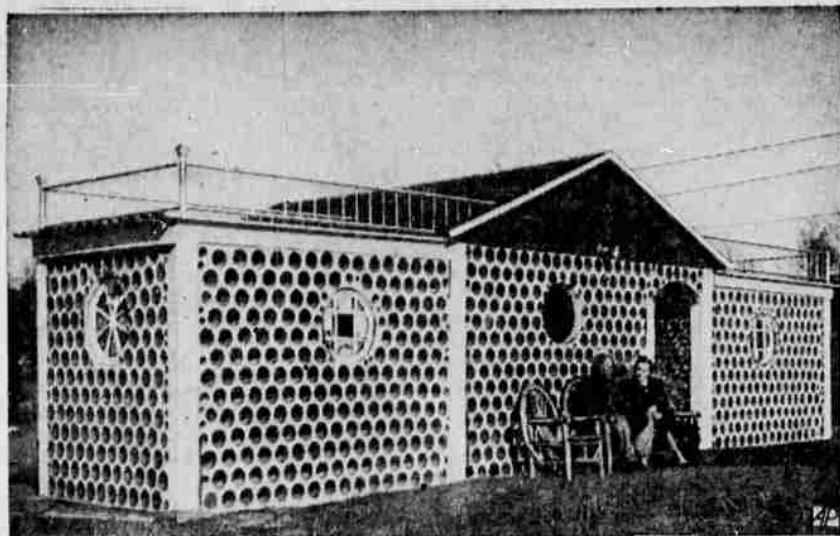
### Current Angling Rules For Umpqua Area Clarified

Considerable misunderstanding of the winter angling regulation now in effect for the Umpqua river system. Zone 3, has been called to the attention of the Oregon State Game commission, according to J. W. Vaughn, regional supervisor.

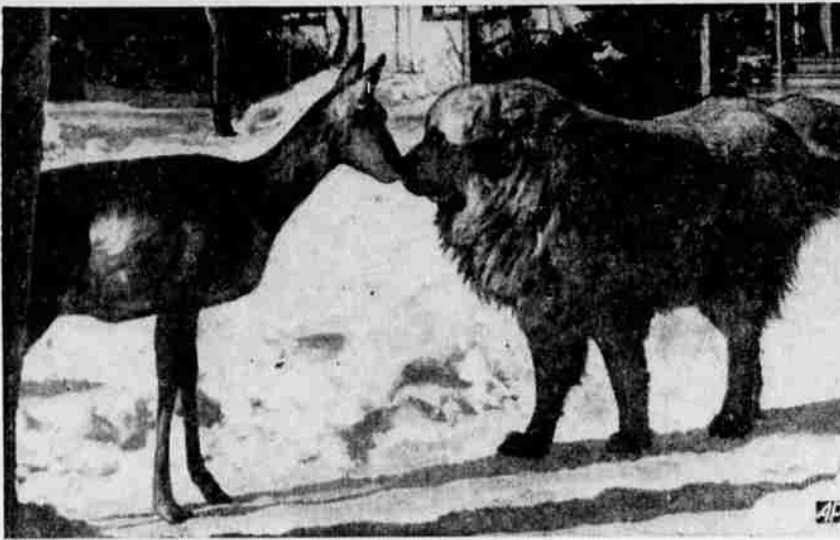
Trout, jack salmon and steelhead, 12 inches and over in length, may legally be taken through Feb. 28. After that date all angling for game fish throughout the drainage is prohibited until the spring salmon season opens on April 15. The current aggregate bag limit for fish 12 inches and over is two (2) fish a day, but not to exceed four (4) fish in any seven consecutive days or in possession. Only those fish 20 inches or over must be tagged.

The season for salmon over 20 inches is currently open only in the Umpqua below Highway 38 bridge at Scottsburg and in the main stem of Smith river below the falls. That season also closes Feb. 28.

In coastal waters, Zone 1, the steelhead season, including trout over 12 inches in length, is open through March 11. Confusion of the Zone 1 closing date with the Zone 3 closing date seems to be the basis of the misunderstanding, Vaughn said.

### Pianist Mental Patient Plays After Four Years

WEST BRENTWOOD, N.Y. —(AP)—An accomplished pianist, who refused to touch a keyboard for four years, gave a recital here Monday at the Pilgrim State hospital, where she is a mental patient.

"Do come again to my next recital," the 30-year-old woman told 600 fellow-patients and visitors after the performance.

Dr. Harry J. Worthing, hospital director, said the pianist was cured, but probably could give a recital outside the hospital.

He added that her case was an outstanding example of music's role in rehabilitation of patients. Miss Edwina Eustis, a contralto who is doing a special project at the hospital for the hospitalized veterans music service, said it took six months to get the woman to attend a music class.

Another two months were needed to get her to sit down at a piano, Miss Eustis said.

### Hearing Slated For Merl Young

WASHINGTON — (AP)—E. Merl Young, named by a senate subcommittee as a wielder of improper influence on RFC loans, plans to face his accusers at a public hearing this week, it has been disclosed.

The subcommittee, headed by Senator Fulbright (D-Ark), charged in a recent report to the Senate that Young and Donald Dawson, a White House aide, were members of a group which had too much voice in the lending of millions by the Reconstruction Finance corporation.

President Truman called the report asinine and said Dawson should not answer it. Fulbright told reporters he will ask the subcommittee to hear Young, probably Wednesday. An informed source said Young has advised the subcommittee he will testify.

### COLOMBIANS TO FIGHT

WASHINGTON — (AP)—Colombian Ambassador Eduardo Zuleta-Angel says a hand-picked battalion of 1,000 Colombian officers and men will leave his country about the first of March to fight in Korea.

The ambassador added in an interview that the men are now being trained in Bogota in modern American methods and weapons by a U. S. military mission.
