The Woman's Missionary society of the First Baptist church will meet Thursday at 2 o'clock at the church parlors. All women of the church are invited.



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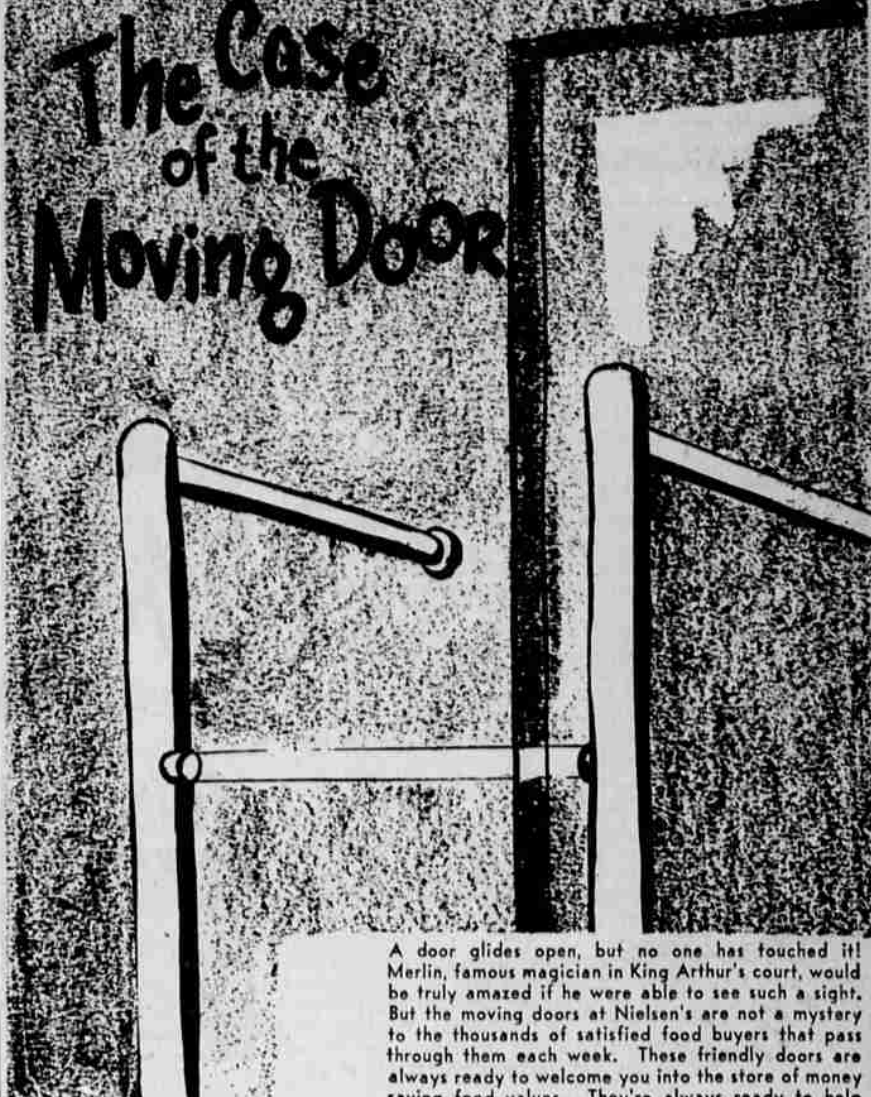
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
