

Yugoslavia Reiterates That Russian Intentions Hostile

Yugoslav's formal charges the past weekend that Russia is preparing the satellites to overthrow Marshal Tito's government are important—but not new.

The official Yugoslav White Paper issued on the subject is, of course, a grave document. It's about the most two-fisted document leveled at Russia since Tito was read out of the Bolshevik fold by the Cominform.

However, it is reviewing a situation which we have been conversant for some time, and it is well that we should understand we aren't faced with a fresh and unexpected crisis.

Yugoslav Foreign Minister Edvard Kardelj of Yugoslavia as far back as 1949 made a long speech before the United Nations assembly outlining this explosive situation. That was for the information of the peace organization, and Yugoslavia didn't ask for any action. A further report was made to the U. N. assembly the following year.

Issued As Warning

Likewise now, I take it that the new White Paper is largely for the information of the western powers and the United Nations. Possibly the Belgrade government also feels that by thus spotlighting the situation it may slow down the anti-Yugoslav activities of the neighboring Balkan satellites.

Naturally the United Nations has been watching this situation carefully as being potentially explosive. Thus far there has seemed to be no occasion for intervention. The break between Moscow and Marshal Tito came in '48, nearly three years ago. It was caused by his rejection of the Bolshevik tenet that Communist nations must surrender their sovereignty to Moscow.

Builds Own Ism

Tito didn't reject communism altogether, however. He built himself a new ism along nationalistic lines. This has become known as Titoism and has spread to the Communist parties of numerous countries, including the satellites.

This appeal of Titoism for many Communist parties has resulted in the recent widespread and drastic purges. Moscow has been carrying these out in all the satellites and has ordered the large Communist parties in France and Italy to clean house. There have been heavy cuts in doubtful membership.

Meantime Moscow has been harassing Yugoslavia through the neighboring satellites. The latest White Paper reiterates that Russia has been applying "direct military pressure" against Yugoslavia and has been supplying the Soviet satellites with arms and troops for the overthrow of Tito's government.

Incidents Numerous

The White Paper declares that in the past three years there have

been almost 2,000 border incidents between Yugoslavia and her eastern neighbors — Romania, Bulgaria and Hungary. Albania is charged with other incidents.

All this has inspired speculation whether war really is in the offing, and if so when it might break. Recent guesses have pointed to the coming spring as the fateful time — but no concrete evidence has been produced.

The position of course is explosive. Moreover a Balkan war almost inevitably would spread into another world conflict. A redeeming feature is that Russia doesn't want this now and so may be expected to use a restraining hand.

And it can be repeated that there is really nothing fresh to add to the existing anxiety.

In-Law Of Stalin Reported Dead

MOSCOW — (P) — The medical administration of the Kremlin announced Monday "with deep sorrow" the death of Olga Evgenyevna Alliluyeva. Pravda, carrying this announcement, said she died Sunday.

This is all of this dispatch yet to come through Soviet censorship. Olga Alliluyeva apparently is a member of Stalin's own household and likely is his sister-in-law.

Stalin's second wife was Nadezhda (Nadya) Alliluyeva, whom he married sometime during the Civil war which followed the revolution, possibly in 1919. She is believed to have committed suicide in 1932 after a spat with Stalin in the presence of high members of his Politburo. Her death so jolted Stalin that he was on the point of resigning from the Communist party leadership, but V. M. Molotov is said to have persuaded him to stay on.

Stalin's first wife was Ekaterina Scavrodzka, who died during the revolution. They had one son, Jacob. Alliluyeva was the mother of two of Stalin's children: Vassily, now a lieutenant-general, and Svetlana, his daughter and constant companion.

Nadezhda was the daughter of an old revolutionary named Alliluyev who once was a close friend of Lenin, and it was through his association with Lenin that Stalin met his second wife. Another daughter of the old Bolshevik, S. A. Alliluyeva, published a book about Stalin in 1946, under the title "Reminiscences." A year later it was harshly denounced in Pravda as being full of error, and apparently since has been withdrawn from circulation.

Burn Treatment Plan Simplified

LOS ANGELES — (P) — The army has decided that this simple, two-phase program is the most practical method of handling thermal burns in the event of an atomic attack:

(1) For second degree or lesser burns covering no more than 20 percent of the body surface, no immediate professional attention at all.

(2) For burns over more than 20 percent of the body surface, the pressure treatment. Four-layer pressure bandages unmedicated will take care of most such cases or 12 to 24 hours, even if 50 to 60 percent of the body surface is affected.

Col. William S. Stone, commandant of the army medical service graduate school in Washington, D. C., told a news conference that this program has been developed through long range research projects which are still in progress.
