

### 3 Civil Defense Deputies Play Big War Roles

Three civilian defense deputies in charge of engineering, public utilities and communications, will play important roles should Roseburg be the scene of a war disaster, Director Col. M. Crawford reports.

Col. Crawford has appointed Arthur Boyer as deputy director in charge of engineering. The deputy is charged with the responsibility of planning and conducting

such operations as necessary for the preservation of public works, streets and bridges as a result of a local disaster.

The engineering deputy will make the necessary surveys for shelter of 8,000 additional population in case of an emergency. This work will be done in cooperation with the deputy director of welfare.

**Utilities For Disaster**

Under the city's civil defense organization, the deputy director

of public utilities is required to make a survey of all public utilities available to the city and the maximum potential. With this information, the director will draw up necessary plans to meet an emergency resulting from the destruction of power plants, water supply systems or gas sources.

The public utilities director will study and recommend measures in an emergency to provide necessary utilities for an added 8,000 local population.

### Ex-Gov. Folsom Says He's Target Of 'Conspiracy'

CULLMAN, Ala. — (AP) — James E. Folsom, six-foot, seven-inch former governor of Alabama who drew national attention as "kissing Jim," charges a "gigantic political conspiracy" has been launched against him.

A legislative committee investigating the state pardon parole system head testimony that the huge ex-governor shared in an alleged \$1,000 payoff for a pardon.

Folsom said the charge was "silly" and declared in a radio address:

"I can go before that committee or the people under oath and before God with clean hands. I hereby ask the committee to stand before the legislature and the people with the same clean hands."

Folsom said a "gigantic conspiracy" existed during the closing

days of his administration. He said his opponents "put on tremendous political pressure to release hot" cases. They hoped thereby to keep the sun from rising again.

The former governor said his political opponents had conducted a constant smear campaign against him since 1946.

"Last week my opposition 'rang the bell' in smears," he added.

Folsom said the present pardon-parole board, appointed by Governor Gordon Persons, was the "most political" since 1939.

He said this was because Persons was able to appoint two members of the three-man board when the Senate refused to confirm two Folsom appointees, and they went out of office with him.

During the last 15 1/2 months of the term, while the board was dominated by Folsom appointees, a total of 1,600 paroles and 350 outright pardons were granted.

W. J. Smith of Mobile, a state docks employee told the legislative committee he had been informed that Folsom, Vinson and Drinkard shared a \$1,000 payoff.

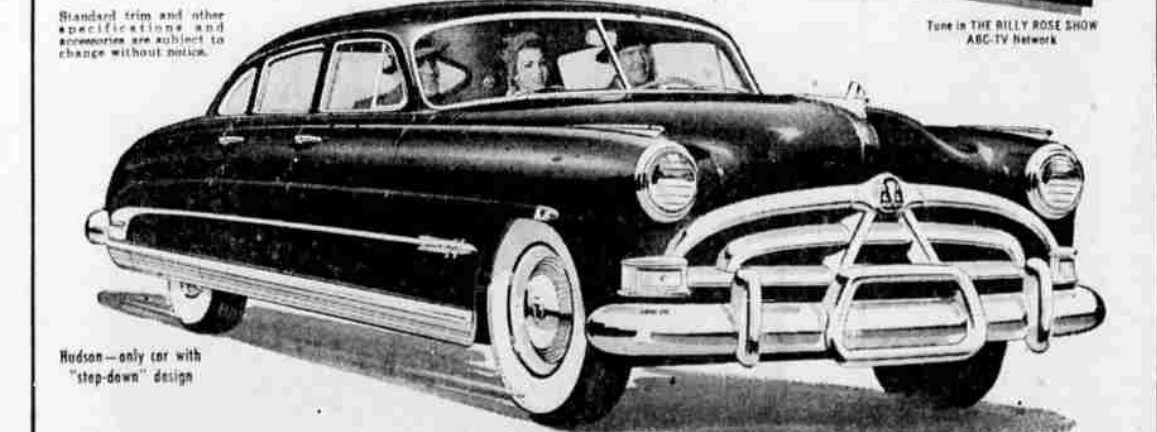
