

# Jones Gunning For Another Mat Win Over Soldat Gorky

Hard-headed Rufus Jones will be gunning for his third victory in four meetings with Soldat Gorky, when the two rugged wrestlers clash at the Roseburg armory arena Saturday night in a continued feud that hit a red-hot pace two weeks ago.

Gorky, the Russian villain, experienced all kinds of trouble during their last meeting — losing a technical decision to Jones, because of Referee Elton Owen's decision; and had a \$25 fine slapped

on him for fighting with Jones in the shower room after the match.

Gorky demanded the re-match and promises the results will be different this time. He also demanded another referee, and the Roseburg wrestling commission has selected Walt "Tinkit" Achui as the third man in the ring.

**Chinese Ace To Referee**

Achui, the great ex-Dayton university football star who earned his schooling by turning pro wrestler, will be making his first ap-

pearance here in some three years. The great Chinese matmaster should be able to handle the two headline principals — with the aid of jiu-jitsu. Owen said he was happy to step down as referee.

Owen has also booked two 30-minute, three-fall preliminaries that promise plenty of colorful action. The semi-final brings together Eddie Williams, the Missouri Scotsman, against The Yellow Mask. The opener will match Maurice LaChappelle, popular

Frenchman, against Danno McDonald, the handsome, young and talented Canadian.

It was rumored here this week that Gorky may bring his brother, Ivan, here Saturday as a second — to assure him of getting a square deal. Achui warned both Gorkys, however, that they had best not try "Any funny stuff."

Reserved seat tickets are on sale at Powell's, and another capacity crowd is anticipated for the weekly wrestling show.
