Services Slated For Observance Of Good Friday

The traditional Good Friday service will be held in the Presbyterian church this Friday, beginning at 12 noon. Following a pattern common throughout Protestant churches, seven different Roseburg pastors will speak upon the "Seven Last Words of Christ" which were uttered by Him from the cross.

The Rev. Clark Robb, pastor of the North Roseburg church, will begin the service at noon by speaking on the first word, "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do." The second word, "Verily I say unto thee, today shalt thou be with me in Paradise," will be presented by the Rev. H. A. Schlatter, pastor of the Church of God. "Woman, behold thy Son;—Behold thy mother," the third word, will be the subject of the message by the Rev. Clarence Anderson, pastor of the Church of the Open Bible.

Three-Hour Service
The pastor of the Free Methodist church, the Rev. H. L. Stegman, will deliver the fourth word, "My God, My God, why hast thou forsaken me?" The Rev. Robert Hall, Presbyterian missionary in charge of new Sunday schools in this area will be the fifth speaker, using the text, "I Thirst." The Faith Lutheran church pastor, the Rev. Willis Erickson, will speak on the sixth word, "It is finished." And the general secretary of the Roseburg Y.M.C.A., the Rev. Merin Donaldson, will conclude the service by presenting the seventh word, "Father, into thy hands I commend my spirit."

The three-hour service is continuous from 12 until 3 p.m., but worshippers will be free to come or go at any time during the service. Approximately 25 minutes is allowed for each of the "Seven Last Words." In addition to the short messages by the ministers, time is allowed for hymn, prayer, scripture reading, and special music in connection with each of the 25 minute periods.

The Good Friday service is officially sponsored by the Roseburg Ministerial association, and it is open to the public. People of all faiths and churches are welcome.

Annual Police Dance Tickets Still Available

A few tickets are still left for the annual Police ball to be held Friday at the armory, Police Chief Calvin Baird reports.

Baird said a block of tickets is being reserved to go on sale at the door the night of the dance. He said any couple who decide to attend at the last minute will be able to dance to the popular music of Jimmie Whetmore and his orchestra.

Whetmore's publicity agents say the orchestra leader's appearance in Roseburg, lumber capital of the nation, reminds him of an unusual experience when he played an engagement at Paskenta, Calif., another lumbering community.

The place was described to them by the manager as a "polite club and hunting resort." The band Whetmore was then playing with packed up at 1 a.m. and started to go—when five shots at their feet halted them.

A lumberjack with a pistol in one hand a flask in the other told them to sit down and play some more—which they did. Whenever the band did not know a number, a prod in the back or a shot in the air with one of the pistols hastened them to "fake it."

It was dawn before the weary lads could get out of the place. All of them are alive and well today—and two survivors are in Jimmie Whetmore's present orchestra.
