overwiselmingly approved a bill to require more accurate cost ac-counting by distributors, and to allow stores to sell for less than the home-delivered price if their costs justify it.

The senate vote, 24 to 5, sends the bill to the House. Sen. Thomas R. Mahoney, Port-land Democrat, said the bill is meaningless, and told the dairy industry to "get ready for the executioner's axe because your go-ter to get it at the next general ing to get it at the next general

Mahoney said he would support an initiative measure to wipe milk control.

milk control.

Charging that the bill "doesn't even begin to fouch the heart of the milk problem, Sen, Richard L. Neuberger, also a Portland Democrat, said Portland has the highest milk prices in the west because milk control guarantees too high prices to producers. He, too, threatened an initiative 10 wipe out the law, under which the state fixes minimum milk prices at the producer, distributor and retail levels.

Day Defends industry

Day Defends Industry Sen. Ben Day, Medford, carried the ball for the dairy industry. He said repeal of milk control would burt consumers more than it would producers, because milk prices would increase. Day denied that

making too much money, and said repeal of the law would force many producers out of business. This, Day added, would make Oregon pay to import milk in from other
