Espionage Case

Los Angeles — (P) — I would do anything to prevent communism from coming to this country, says a college instructor indicted on charges that he lied in testimony about an alleged spy ring.

Clarence Howard Vetterli, an assistant professor of journalism at El Camino Junior College near here, was arrested Wednesday.

The indictment accuses Vetterli of perjury before a grand jury investigating espionage here in 1949. It charges he lied when he denied he had been told Ignacy Samuel

Federal agents and by the Witezak merely as a friend, Vetterli said. "We me to university of Southern California, I never gave anyone any money to go to Japan and I stand by my previous testimony."

Federal agents said Vetterli's testimony threw them off the trail and hampered investigation of Witczak, who disappeared in 1945.

Vetterli, who is married and has two children, has taught at El Camino since 1949. He previously taught at high schools.

## Best-Seller List Topped As Sequel To Mac's Speech

NEW YORK — (A) — Gen. Douglas MacArthur has cracked the best seller lists with the by-products of his "old soldiers" speech to Congress April 19.

All told, recordings of the dra-matic address are expected to reach a total sale of 2,000,000.

reach a total sale of 2,000,000.
Equally "phenomenal" sales are reported for the hastily produced records of the "Old Soldiers Never Die" ballad, which the general revived into an over-night hit in his speech.

The address is out in book form, too. Rand McNally printed 250,000 copies at 50 cents each. The publishers report, "all the distributors have gobbled them up; they're selling very fast."

With unprecedented speed, four

With unprecedented speed, four recording companies brought the speech out on wax within four or five days after it was delivered.

Columbia records estimates its
sales at between 10,000 and 15,000
a day. RCA Victor says its total
up to now is 150,000. Capitol Records say it is selling "several thousand" a day, Mercury records
have sold about 40,000 to date.

quickly."
