PORTLAND — (AP) — Removal of George Alexander as warden of the state penitentiary at Salem was urged by the Multnomah County Democratic central committee.

A resolution urged that "a competent person be appointed to correct the abuses that have been occurring and possibly now are occurring at the institution."

**Teacher Accused Of Lying In Red Espionage Case**

LOS ANGELES — (AP) — "I would do anything to prevent communism from coming to this country," says a college instructor indicted on charges that he lied in testimony about an alleged spy ring.

Clarence Howard Vetterli, an assistant professor of journalism at El Camino Junior College near here, was arrested Wednesday.

The indictment accuses Vetterli of perjury before a grand jury investigating espionage here in 1949. It charges he lied when he denied he had been told Ignacy Samuel

Witczak was a Communist agent and when he denied furnishing money to various persons to go to Japan.

Witczak was identified as a Soviet spy by Igor Gouzenko, former code clerk at the Soviet embassy in Ottawa, Ont., during the Canadian espionage trial of 1946.

Federal authorities linked the trips to Japan were believed to be in connection with a Russian espionage ring there in 1941.

"I knew Witczak merely as a friend," Vetterli said. "We met while we were both students at the University of Southern California. I never gave anyone any money to go to Japan and I stand by my previous testimony."

Federal agents said Vetterli's testimony threw them off the trail and hampered investigation of Witczak, who disappeared in 1945.

Vetterli, who is married and has two children, has taught at El Camino since 1949. He previously taught at high schools.

**OPS Director Named For Oregon District**

PORTLAND — (AP) — Willis A. West, Portland attorney, has been named enforcement director for the Oregon district price stabilization office.

C. C. Spears was appointed chief of the investigation section and Wayne E. Kain, assistant chief.

West, an army lieutenant colonel in World War II, was a staff judge advocate and served as chief of the war crimes commission in the China theater.

Spears, a former FBI agent, has his own investigation agency here. Kain is a special intelligence for the federal treasury department.
