

Bible Society Of America Presses Onward Full Tilt On Its 135-Year Mission

NEW YORK — (AP) — Had you lived in New York when James Madison was President, you might have read in one of 22 daily papers published here on May 10, 1816, that some well-known citizens met that day in city hall.

You would have noticed that John Jay, first chief justice of the supreme court; novelist James Fenimore Cooper and Dr. Lyman Beecher were among those who met in a maple-paneled room to arrange for the "distribution of the scriptures without favor or comment."

They founded the American Bible society that spring day 135 years ago. And today the organization is still going strong, but it has added some twists that would rock on its well-polished assembly back on its 135th birthday.

Consider, for example, the new, slick - paper magazine, half-filled with photographs, just published by the society. It's the gospel of Saint Luke, dressed up in the format of a weekly newsmagazine.

Other gospels and the Acts of the Apostles are slated for the same streamlined treatment.

Packet Size Developed
With approximately the same number of words as "Gone with the Wind," the Bible has proved a tough book to squeeze down to pocket size — but the American Bible society has done that, too — and made the print large enough to read with ease.

"The society has done everything but publish a Bible especially designed for reading in bed—and that may come yet," says Dr. Robert T. Taylor, one of four general secretaries of the organization.

Since its foundation, the society has turned out more than 300,000 Bibles in all shapes and sizes and in 40 languages for distribution all over the globe.

From its two offices here, the society distributes Bibles in 55 languages for use in this country alone. The largest number of foreign language Bibles published for U. S. distribution are in Spanish.

"We find," says Dr. Taylor, "that a man usually likes to read the Bible in the language he prays in, and that's usually the language of his childhood."

Persecution Overcome
The society sells its Bibles at cost. Where there is demand but no funds, it gives them away. Financial support comes from individual gifts, contributions by Protestant denominations, legacies and annuities.

Bible societies continue their work today despite clamp-downs by unfriendly governments in some parts of the world. Taylor reports Bible distribution still goes on in China, but how long the Reds will tolerate such open circulation is uncertain.

In Korea, Red troops have executed whole families found in possession of Bibles, yet even there, Dr. Taylor states, underground traffic in Bibles goes on.

"The society's purpose today," Dr. Taylor declares, "is to satisfy the spiritual hunger of people that no government can either assuage or stamp out."

Chinese Reds Lack Food In Korea
SOMEWHERE IN KOREA — Lt. Gen. Edward M. Almond, commander of the U. S. 10th corps, says the Chinese armies in Korea are "willing on the vine" for lack of supplies.

"It's a marvel to me how the Chinese can support the massed army they have in Korea," he said in an interview.

"Where any army operates in foreign territory it must have granaries. By tradition the Chinese fought from one granary to another. We have denied them the granaries. The United States is operating in a barren part of Korea, a long way from their bases. I just don't see how they can feed the masses they have to feed."

Almond said American artillery and air have been systematically destroying whatever stocks of food, ammunition and other supplies the enemy has stored up.

He warned that the enemy probably was preparing for another attack, and added:

"If they want to keep on coming we are prepared for them."

He said the current fall is a Communist maneuver to withdraw from artillery range.

"But our policy is to keep punching, punching, punching," he said. "We will keep punching into their massed areas."

George Bielle and Lois Patterson are attending as senators; Joanne Page, Yvonne Cooper, Frank West and Darlene McCallister are representatives and Noeren Allen is clerk of the House. Two sophomore Hi-Y members — Donald Stumbo and Donald Smith — are also attending.

Delegates from all over the state swarmed to Salem today to participate in the legislature. Purpose of the event is to prepare a "selected group of young men for moral and political leadership in the American democratic process by providing guidance, training and experience in the theory and practice of determining public policy."

Senators and representatives are elected to the legislature by Hi-Y clubs in the area. The delegates explore state issues of concern to a "selected group of young men for moral and political leadership in the American democratic process by providing guidance, training and experience in the theory and practice of determining public policy."

Some of the bills being considered at the current session include: an act providing for periodic re-examination for drivers' licenses, recommended by the senior Hi-Y; an act requiring the consolidation of school districts in certain cases, recommended by the sophomore Hi-Y; an act requiring uniform system of traffic lights and signals in the state, a sophomore Hi-Y project; and an act requiring vocational guidance in public high schools in the state, a senior Hi-Y project.
