"The society has done everything but publish a Bible especially designed for reading in bed—and that may come yet." says Dr. Robert T. Taylor, one of four general secretaries of the organization.

Since its foundation, the society has 12-ned out more than 200, 200, 200 Bibles in all shapes and sizes and in 40 languages for distribution all over the globe.

From its two offices here, the society distributes Bibles in 35 languages for use in this country aloe.

The society sells its B ib l e s at cost. Where there is demand but no funds, it gives them away. Financial support comes from individual gifts, contributions by Protestant denominations, legacies and annuities.
