Soviet Paper Declares U.S. Troops Using Gas

MOSCOW — (AP)—A dispatch in Pravda says American troops are using tear gas in Korea and have other types of poison gas shells in reserve in Japan. The official Communist party newspaper relayed a dispatch from the Chinese Communist news agency Sinhua which quoted an American prisoner of war as saying he had seen artillery shells and grenades with tear gas charges at munition dumps, and

these were "frequently used at the front." The prisoner was identified only as Lt. L. Moss, who was with an artillery unit of the U.S. 24th division. Moss was quoted as saying that Communist troops in Japan frequently practice with the use of tear gas and other types of poison gas shells.

"Second Chance" Movie Stated At North Roseburg

The religious movie, "Second Chance," will be shown at the North Roseburg church Sunday night at 7:30 p. m. The film is based upon an original story by Faith Baldwin, and tells of the best things of life by fixing their aims on what is "second best." The one hour and 15 minute picture is inter-denominational and open to the public.

MASTITIS CONTROL SEEN
OSLO — (AP)—Effective veterinary control may reduce cases of mastitis—a glandular infection of the cow's udder—to the vanishing point in less than a year, experiments here show. Dr. Ottar Bratlie, head of the state institute for mastitis research

in Oslo, says the institute has succeeded in wiping out mastitis in the Lesja area during the ten month period from March 1950 to February 1951. The infected cattle are given penicillin and the cow sheds are thoroughly disinfected.

Piano For County Hospital Purpose Of Junior Group

Junior Community aides, through cooked food sales and other activities, are striving to raise funds to purchase a piano for use at the new county hospital. The girls, students in the senior high school, report they have about half the needed funds. Forthcoming sales and other events will be held as benefits to be used in financing the proposed donation. A letter of appreciation recently was written to the organization by the county court, expressing gratitude for help given by the aides in preparing the hospital for its public opening, and for service as guides at the open house.

Members visit patients in the county hospital frequently to visit, write letters and perform other services. When a piano is obtained, the girls plan to present weekly song-fests, skits and programs for entertainment of the patients; it is announced. Miss Joan Leach is president of the organization, and Miss Elizabeth Randall is faculty adviser.
