Senator Labels Some Candidates For Presidency

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Senator Paul Douglas (D-Ill.) has attached some labels to a few possible presidential candidates.

Here are the labels. See if you can match them with the men Douglas had in mind:

1. "Able and virtile — a little too old" for the job of president.
2. "Great recuperative powers—don't count him out."
3. The job would be "too big" for this one, even though "certain ill-advised persons" have proposed him as a candidate.
4. "We Democrats have hopes" that this one is a Democrat. If he is, said Douglas, then he is a possible Democratic candidate.

Answers:
1. Gen. Douglas MacArthur. Douglas said he believed the 71-year-old MacArthur probably would prefer a more quiet life than he'd get as president.

2. President Truman, of course. Douglas recalled the 1948 election, when Mr. Truman was all but counted out before the voting started.

3. Senator Douglas.

4. Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower, often mentioned as a possible candidate for both parties.

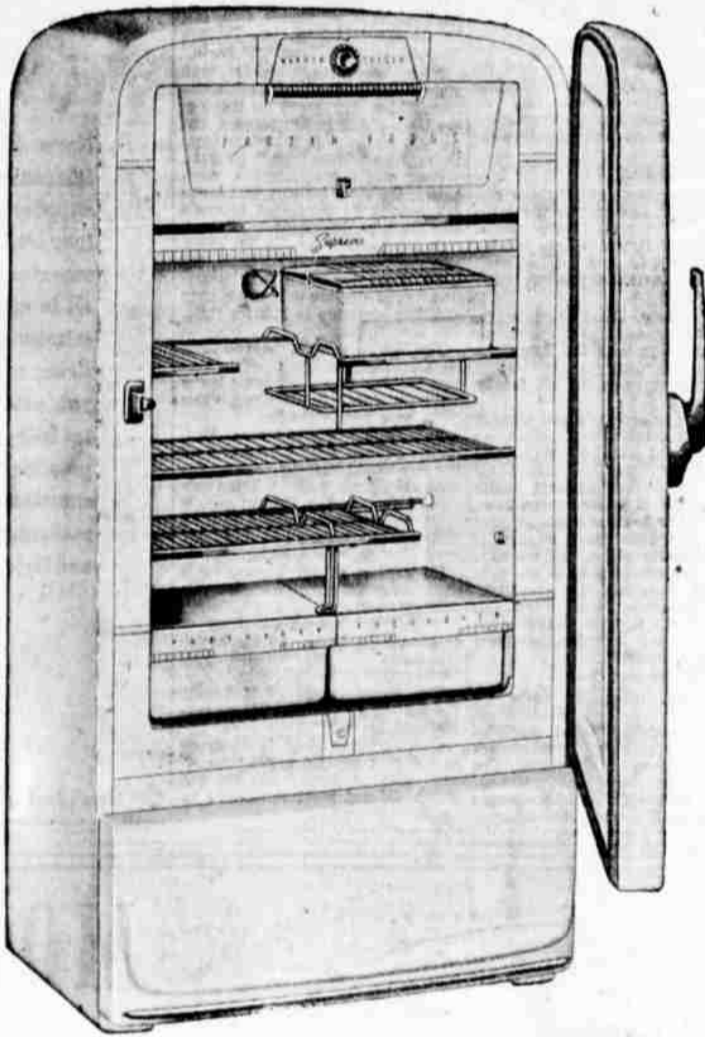

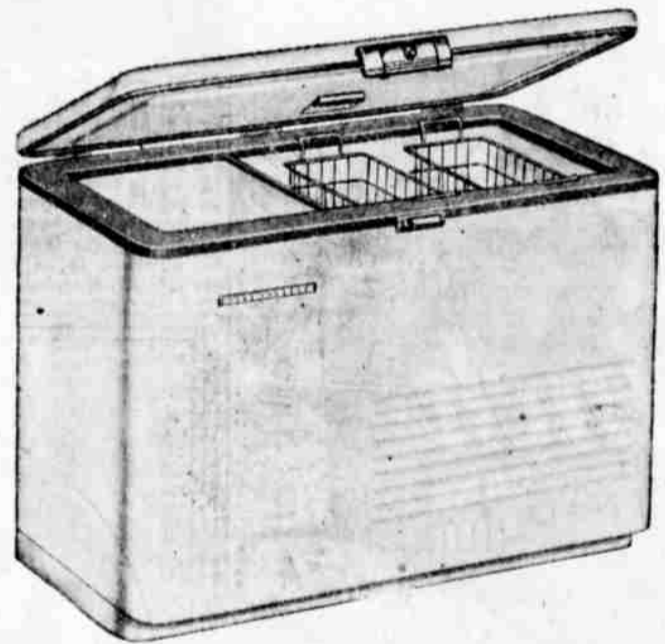

Western Europe Production Up; More Required

WASHINGTON — (AP) — The Economic Cooperation Administration today reported new production records in western Europe and called for even greater output to meet defense goals.

Industrial output in the Marshall plan countries has reached an all-time peak, 38 percent higher than in 1938, ECA said in a report to Congress.

The report, covering the last three months of 1950, said agricul-

tural production also established a new record, 10 percent higher than pre-war levels.

But, the agency cautioned: "Western Europe's production must be further expanded if defense programs are to be accomplished without materially reducing living standards."

ECA conceded that greater industrial and agricultural production will be difficult in coming months because of rising prices and "critical shortages of basic raw materials."

But, it said, it is imperative for output to increase further if the western European nations are to "make a contribution to defense production of the magnitude that is needed."

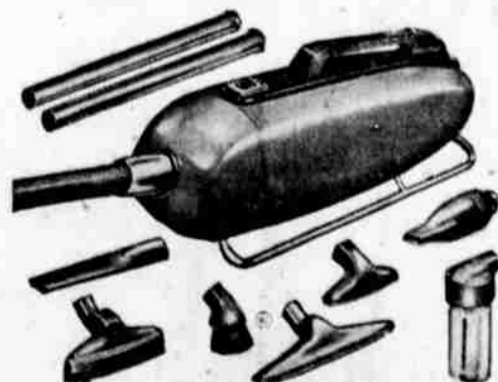

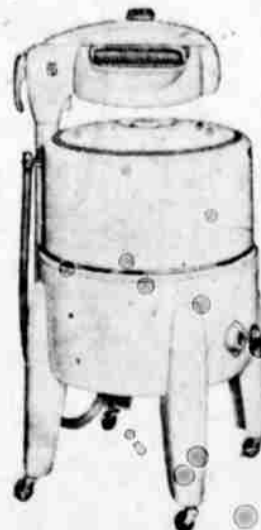
