FAIRBANKS, Alaska — (\mathcal{P}) — Falling through the air is no nev-city to ex - paratrooper Richard Beckman.

But Beckman had no parachute when he tumbled six stories from an apartment building project, lander on a concrete sidewalk — and lived to talk about it.

Beckman, 25, suffered only bruises and a possible small frac-ture of one rib, said an astonished physician, Dr. J. 1, Weston. "A strong shoulder and lots of luck," were credited by Dr. Wes-ton with what he called a "miracu-lous escape from death."

"He apparently landed on his shoulder, and his outflung arm cushioned his bead from the ce-ment," the doctor said. "But I don't see how he could escape almost un-reinned." injured." injured."
