Twenty-Four Best Women Bowlers Meet In Seattle

SEATTLE, (AP)—Twenty-four of the nation's best women bowlers aim for the 1-2 places tonight as the 32nd annual Women's International Bowling Congress launches its 36-day season. They'll be bowling in the annual sweepstakes, actually not a part of the W.I.B.C., but an annual test which starts the prolonged tourney on its way.

The sweeps will feature 24 district winners competing in two divisions for two of the most coveted titles in women's bowling. A 145-pin average is the dividing line. The dozen averaging that figure or above will compete in the so-called major division. The other dozen compete in the minor division. They start at 9:30 p.m. (EDT). The tourney proper starts at 11:30 p.m., with 18 squads of booster teams from Seattle. Out-of-towners, including teams from Milwaukee, Wis., Cleveland and Indianapolis start leveling tomorrow.
