Bishop Urges Culling Of Inferior Human Strains

LONDON — (F) —Birmingham's aging, outspoken hishop, Dr. E. W. Barnes, urged overcrowded countries like Britain to think about breeding out their inferior human strains.

Long a controversial advocate of birth control, sterilization and population control, the 77-year-old Church of England bishop told the West London Medico Chirurgical society:
