## Yoncalla Area Schools Propose Consolidation

An election in the school districts of Yoncalla grade school district 32, Scotts Valley and Pleasant Valley for the purpose of providing a six-year high school at Yoncalla was proposed at a recent mass meeting in the Yoncalla high school, according to the Drain Enterprise.

Such an expansion is calculated to ease the congestion in Yoncalla grade school and the Scotts Valley school. The move would necessitate the addition of several classrooms to the Yoncalla high school building.

The resolution was forwarded to the Yoncalla high school board.
