Poultry Field Day Planned Saturday On Local Grounds

Professor Wilbur Cooney of Oregon State college will be one of the main speakers at the Douglas county Poultry Field day to be held in Roseburg on Saturday, at the Douglas county fairgrounds, according to Wayne Mosher, assistant county extension agent. The meeting will start at 10:30 a. m.

Dr. Paul Bernier of Oregon State college will speak on "Farm Flock Breeding Possibilities for the Hatching Egg Producer." Dr. Bernier is the poultry geneticist at the college and will bring birds to demonstrate points in his talk.

Professor Cooney will give a colling demonstration covering both white leghorns and new Hampshire and will discuss selecting or culling the pullet flock at the time of housing them in the laying house.

All poultrymen in the county are cordially invited to attend and

bring the family. A free lunch will be furnished at noon by feed dealers, hatcherymen and processors in the county. An attempt is being made to have E. E. Fallis, state poultry grading inspector, give a short talk and answer questions. All speakers will answer questions whenever possible.

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
