

Doctor Raps Colleagues On Business Ethics

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J. — (AP) — A small segment of American surgeons, was accused here by one of their colleagues of performing needless operations, charging too much and splitting fees.

The charges were made before the American Medical Association in a speech by Dr. I. S. Ravdin, chief surgeon at the University of Pennsylvania school of medicine and hospital, Philadelphia.

The "small segment" also was accused of "ghost surgery" and of calling in consultants unnecessarily. In "ghost surgery" a physician

hires a surgeon, never seen by the anesthetized patient, to perform the operation.

Dr. Ravdin, saying these practices threaten "our great heritage," called for a housecleaning.

The doctor, an army brigadier general now doing government work, declared:

"In the attack now being made on American medicine, surgeons unfortunately have provided a considerable amount of ammunition which is being used by those who would destroy medicine as it is and should be practiced."

Health Workers To Attend Annual Summer Meeting

Mrs. W. F. Amiot, executive secretary of the Douglas County Tuberculosis and Health Association, and Mrs. F. V. Johnson, volunteer worker, will leave Monday for Minneapolis to attend the annual summer institute, at Linfield college June 18 to 22.

This institute is planned for officers of the county associations, chairmen of committees, county executive secretaries, volunteer workers and other interested individuals who the county associations wish to advance in their work.

A state-wide representation will be offered a diversified program, according to Mrs. Amiot. From California will come Jay McCarthy, director of health education with the California Tuberculosis and Health Association. Amo De Bernardis, supervisor of international materials, Portland public schools, will be another instructor of note.

Many workshops will be featured. One will be a session on the seal sale, held especially for Christmas seal volunteer chairmen throughout the state. An invitation has been extended to many of the Douglas county chairmen to attend.

Mrs. Amiot was chosen as a member of the executive state planning committee for the institute's program and is also serving on the committee for "idea night" Tuesday, June 19, at 7:30 o'clock.

Folk Dancers Schedule Festival At Kennedy's

The clubs will host a delegation of some 500 visiting members of the Oregon Federation of Folk dancers.

Inductees Offered Enlistment Chance

Selective service registrants who have received notice to report for pre-induction examination or those registrants who have previously received their pre-induction examination, may enlist in the armed service of their choice on or before July 15, 1951, it was announced by the U. S. army and U. S. air force recruiting service headquarters, Sixth army, in San Francisco, Calif.

Heretofore, regulations prohibited voluntary enlistment of registrants who had received notification, from their local draft boards, to report for examination at a specified examining and induction station.

M-Sgt. Ernest J. Grimm, in charge of the local U. S. army and U. S. air force recruiting station, added that due to the controlled daily flow of recruits to the army and air force basic training centers, applicants should report to the recruiting station at least five days prior to the expected date of their departure in order to complete processing of applications for enlistment.
