



## New U.S. Sub Superior To Blimp On Speed Basis Calves, Lambs To Blimp On Speed Basis AKRON, O. - (P) - In any fu-ture battle of blimp versus snorkel, the U. S. navy can throw in the workl's largest non-rigid airship. The new giant "ZPN" type was light tested here Monday. With a length of 324 feet and an envelope holding 875,000 cubic feet of belium gas, the ZPN is nearly twice as fast as the blimps-some 130 in number-used for subma-rine-chasing in the last war. The big ZPN was designed to do about 75 knois an hour. But en-gineers at Goodyear Aircraft Corp. which produced the monster for the navy, said a more important attribute was the ability to hover over the sea at very low speeds. The new craft took two years to build. **Given For Two**
