Calves, Lambs Given For Two Rodeo Scrambles

Roseburg firms donating calves and lambs for the scrambles in the Douglas county Sheriff's posse rodeo Saturday and Sunday are making a great contribution to the welfare of Douglas county youths and to the rodeo, notes W. H. "Doc" Carter.

Carter estimates the aggregate cost of the 13 lambs and 10 calves at more than \$1,600 — an amount that he terms a substantial contribution to the affair.

The lamb scramble, for 4-H girls, is the last part of the Saturday rodeo show, and the calf scramble is the final event on the Sunday show. In the latter, 4-H boys will scramble for five calves first and Future Farmers will finish up by capturing the remaining five.

The youth gains possession by capturing the animal but he must break him to lead and bring him back in the fall for the Douglas county fair for show purposes. All the calves are purebred Herefords.

New U.S. Sub Superior To Blimp On Speed Basis

AKRON, O. — (AP) — In any future battle of blimp versus snorkel, the U. S. navy can throw in the world's largest non-rigid airship. The new giant "ZPN" type was flight tested here Monday.

With a length of 324 feet and an envelope holding 875,000 cubic feet of helium gas, the ZPN is nearly twice as fast as the blimps—some 130 in number—used for submarine-chasing in the last war.

The big ZPN was designed to do about 75 knots an hour. But engineers at Goodyear Aircraft Corp., which produced the monster for the navy, said a more important attribute was the ability to hover over the sea at very low speeds.

The new craft took two years to build.

Canned Fishery Products Most Valuable In History

WASHINGTON — (AP) — The Fish and Wildlife service says that the U. S. pack of canned food from fishery products, for animal consumption, last year was the largest and most valuable in history.

The agency said also that the U. S. and Alaska pack of canned shrimp was the largest since 1942, but the pack of canned crabs was 15 percent smaller than in 1949.

The 1950 pack of fishery products for animal food totaled 2,721,303 standard cases, valued at \$13,870,870 to the canner. This was an increase of 41 percent in volume and 60 percent in value over the 1949 pack.
