### Sex Hygiene Ideas Bring Suspension Of Male Teacher

NEW YORK — (AP) — A male professor at Hunter college, a city school for women, has been suspended on a charge of taking a "sensational and unwholesome approach" in teaching sex hygiene.

The professor, Dr. William J. Fordrun, says he was suspended "because I am a strong advocate of trying to overcome the teaching of communism in morals."

He said at his home in suburban Scarsdale, N. Y., that his teaching has been the "direct opposite" of "sensational and unwholesome."

Fordrun's suspension was announced by the City Board of Higher Education.

The board disclosed several charges against Fordrun, a member of physiology, health and hygiene faculty and director of the college medical office.

The board's announcement said "he is charged with making loose and indiscriminate accusations against large groups of colleagues."

Also, it said "he is charged with a deliberate and continuous attempt to press upon students his own social, and political, ethical, moral and religious views, to the exclusion of beliefs held by large and well-respected groups in the community." No details were cited.

### Money Charges Send Ex-Mayor To Prison

JUNEAU, Wis. — (AP) — A former army major and once mayor of Beaver Dam, Wis., was sentenced Monday to 30 to 56 years in the Wisconsin state prison on 64 charges of forgery, obtaining money under false pretenses and larceny as a bailee.

Vern H. Knoll, 34, pleaded guilty to all 64 counts resulting from the disappearance of about \$250,000 which clients had entrusted to him as an attorney. An auditor said "the probable figure" was between \$225,000 and \$240,000.

MUSE AND MUSIC: One of the most highly regarded of the locally produced shows at KRRR is LeRoy Hiatt's "Muse and Music," heard each Thursday morning at 10:45. It was back in January of 1947 that the program first went on the air, and it has been on continuously during that time under sponsorship of the Roseburg Color Center.

At the station there are some 50 books of poetry from which Hiatt obtains his selections from the library, or from requests. Each program requires several hours of preliminary work — the reading of the poems to determine suitable selections, and the picking of the right background music.

"The selection of music," says Hiatt, "is more delicate than the selection of the poems." The right background music must be used at all times and this is a tedious

task in itself for the music must be screened to fit the theme of the reading. He draws from the vast and extensive RCA Victor Red Seal library at the station, as well as from our transcription service and personal albums.

Tomorrow's edition of "Muse and Music" will have poems and music hinting of rodeo time. And there may be a few selections by Robert Frost like "The Cow in Appletime."
