### Evangelism Campaign Set By Perturbed Oregon Sect

SALEM — (AP)—Oregon Methodists will have a big evangelism campaign next March, delegates to the state Methodist conference decided.

Dr. Harry Williams, Philadelphia, who will conduct the campaign, said at the session here: "There's a terrible urgency for constructive spiritual activity in these times. Our boys in Korea are giving their lives to buy time for us to make a Christian America and a Christian world."

Dr. Williams said similar campaigns in other states have added 59,000 new members to the church in the past year.

The conference accepted a report recommending minimum salaries be increased to \$1,800 a year for single ministers, and \$2,200 for married ministers.

NEW YORK — (AP)—The famous flag the marines raised on Mount Suribachi in the battle for Iwo Jima went on display under armed guard Friday. The emblem seldom has been seen outside the marine corps museum at Quantico, Va. Maj. T. M. Field, who brought the flag here for the Fifth marine division convention, said this might be the last time it is displayed outside Quantico. The picture made by Joe Rosenthal, then an Associated Press photographer, showing the marines raising the flag under enemy fire, has made the flag familiar to millions.

### Lifelong Friend Willed Flowers

NORRISTOWN, Pa. — (AP)—Once a week from now on six red roses will be placed on the grave of Mrs. Clara Boyd.

And for certain very special days these remembrances are specified: A red rose heart on St. Valentine's day; potted tulips, hyacinths and daffodils on Easter; six pink carnations on Mothers day; six red roses every June 6 and June 17, anniversaries of Mrs. Boyd's birth and death; three chrysanthemums on Thanksgiving day, and a wreath on Christmas.

Such are provisions in the will of Alfred M. Evans, a retired druggist of nearby Roxborough, who died last month at the age of 83. Evans, a bachelor, and Mrs. Boyd were lifelong friends.

The will, filed for probate in Montgomery county court sets up a \$2,500 trust fund to provide the flowers for years to come.

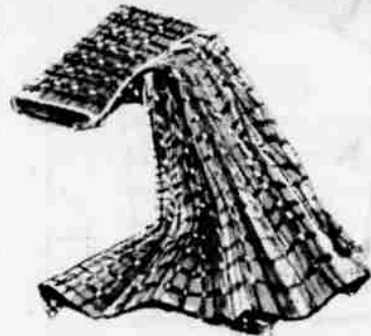
