MAY USE DRAFT

Air Force Unable To Meet June 30 Manpower Goal

WASHINGTON — (AP) — The air force says it will be unable to meet its June 30 manpower goal of 850,000, and a lack of volunteers may soon cause it to reach for draftees.

Previously, only the army has taken draftees. The air force, like the navy and marines, have filled its quotas with volunteers. The air force enlisted 58,000 volunteers in January, but the May figure was only 11,000. Army figures for the same months were 29,000 and 9,000. Navy and marine volunteering has also slackened.

Volunteering is now apparently increasing, but an air force spokesman told a reporter: "A continuing dearth of volunteer enlistments would obviously force us to use the draft."

He said the air force is worried by the quality of men it is receiving as well as the quantity. Air force figures show its enlistments during the last two months have been predominately in the lowest intelligence group.

At the start of this year, the air force had a June 30 manpower goal of 971,000. This total was reduced to 850,000 in February, after volunteers temporarily flooded air training facilities beyond capacity.

Army Reaches Goal

In the first six days of June, 4,300 men without previous service volunteered for the air force. Officials hoped this upward trend would increase after the end of the school year.

Secretary of the Army Pace said last week the army had already reached its June 30th 1,500,000 manpower goal. This total includes reservists now on active duty and a large number of national guardsmen.

The navy said today it will meet its programmed 705,000 manpower goal by June 30, although navy volunteering has dropped sharply since the beginning of the year.

In January, the navy accepted 38,500 volunteers. Last month it got only 13,800 volunteers.

Marine corps figures are not available but it is known that the corps' current manpower goal is 204,000, which will probably be reached by June 30.

Reasons For Decline Vary

The services give varying reasons for the general decline in volunteering. Spokesmen say April and May, just before the school year ends, are generally bad months. Some officers blamed the dearth of volunteers on the army's reduced draft calls. When the army was drafting 80,000 men a month many youths thought it would be better to volunteer and get into the service of their choice.

One defense source estimated there is a frozen pool of about 750,000 men of draft or volunteering age, who have taken, or had notice to take, pre-induction physical exams. There was general agree-

Embarking on Montreal Friday, June 22, on the S. S. Empress of France, they will sail 1,000 miles down the St. Lawrence before entering the Atlantic. They arrive in Liverpool June 29.

Trips In Scotland

The group will spend four days and take trips around Edinburgh, Scotland. They then travel south to New Castle, Bergen and Oslo, where they stay three days. From Oslo they go to Stockholm, Sweden, and Copenhagen, Denmark. They arrive in Amsterdam, Holland, July 17, and continue to Brussels, Luxembourg and Zurich. After three days in Geneva, Switzerland,

they leave by train for Paris, arriving July 31. They will spend a week in Paris. Arriving August 6, they spend 5 days in London. In Stratford, England, they will attend a performance at the Shakespearean memorial theater. They sail from Liverpool on August 14, arriving at Montreal, Aug. 21, thence to Chicago and west to Portland, arriving home August 25.

Husband Freed In "Mercy" Shooting Of His Wife

CENTRALIA, Wash. — (AP) — An 81-year-old husband admitted firing two "mercy" shots into his wounded 65-year-old wife Sunday "to help her along" because of the pain she was suffering.

After hearing this testimony, a coroner's jury at a five-hour inquest ordered the aged husband, George Drake, set free. The jury stated: "No crime was committed because the woman was dead when the last two shots were fired."

According to the testimony, Mrs. Drake was first shot with a rifle in her own hands while her husband tried to wrest it from her. This because of a nervous breakdown, relatives testified.

Oilman McCarthy 'Named' In Imprisonment Suit
