National Forest Tracts Set Aside For Various Uses

WASHINGTON — (AP) — The camp grounds, recreation areas government has set aside 34,861 and ranger stations.

Some of the forest land withdrawn from settlement or mining or commercial development will be used for skiing and other winter

or commercial development will be used for sking and other winter sports.

The lands are in 47 tracts in 14 states and Alaska. Although they are part of areas administered by the Forest service in the department of Agriculture, the authority for such withdrawals rests with the secretary of Interior.

Marion McLawson, director of Interior's Bureau of Land Management, said in a news release the withdrawals are designed to prevent mining activities in the specific areas to be used for administrative or recreational purposes. However, oil and gas development will be permitted where circumstances warrant.

The lands withdrawn include: Oregon—Deschutes national forest. Todd lake forest camp, 170 acress. Whitman national forest. Marble Creek forest camp, 80 acress.
