**Former Roseburg Man Aboard Patrol Frigate**

Earl M. Sether, seaman, USN, Glendale, is serving aboard the patrol frigate USS Sausalito in the Far East. One of a group of 14 frigates returned to the U. S. by the Russians, the Sausalito was recommissioned at the U. S. fleet activities, Yokosuka, Japan last September. The Sausalito was first used as a training ship for South Korean naval personnel and later as harbor entrance control ship during the evacuation of UN troops from Hungnam. She is now adding the fire power of her guns to the naval shore bombardments of the Korean coast.

**Dr. K. S. Latourette Heads U.S. Baptists**

BUFFALO, N. Y. — (AP) — Dr. Kenneth S. Latourette, professor of missions and Oriental history at Yale university, was elected President of the American Baptist convention here. Dr. Latourette is the author of a comprehensive seven-volume work, "The History of the Expansion of Christianity." W. D. Wright of Idaho Falls, Idaho, was elected first vice-president. **State Labor Federation Passes Resolutions**

KLAMATH FALLS — (AP) — The State Federation of Labor convention Wednesday supported a resolution for relaxation of building and credit controls to stimulate construction "without interference," and called for effective price controls and a tax program "to siphon off excess profits." Other resolutions: Proposed greater care in endorsing political candidates. Supported a plan to study displacement of workers by machines so that programs could be worked out to make machines beneficial "to mankind instead of the monster they threaten to become if something is not done." Asked unions to support measures to help the physically handicapped. Again disapproved daylight saving time.

**Pastor's Plea Calls Off Leap From Bridge**

SEATTLE — (AP) — A young timber worker climbed safely down from a precarious perch atop a bridge superstructure 120 feet above Lake Washington Monday night in answer to a clergyman's pleas and prayers. Sheriff's Capt. Wayne Ambrose said Elder G. G. Ziegler, district pastor of the Seventh-Day Adventist churches, Kirkland, climbed a fire ladder, prayed with the youth, and talked him into descending. The youth said he had had domestic difficulties, Ambrose said.

**National Forest Tracts Set Aside For Various Uses**

WASHINGTON — (AP) — The government has set aside 34,861 acres within national forests for use as administrative centers, camp grounds, recreation areas and ranger stations.

Some of the forest land withdrawn from settlement or mining or commercial development will be used for skiing and other winter sports. The lands are in 47 tracts in 14 states and Alaska. Although they are part of areas administered by the Forest service in the department of Agriculture, the authority for such withdrawals rests with the secretary of Interior. Marion McLawson, director of Interior's Bureau of Land Management, said in a news release the withdrawals are designed to prevent mining activities in the specific areas to be used for administrative or recreational purposes. However, oil and gas development will be permitted where circumstances warrant. The lands withdrawn include: Oregon—Deschutes national forest, Todd lake forest camp, 170 acres; Whitman national forest, Marble Creek forest camp, 80 acres. Washington — Wenatchee national forest, Swauk creek recreation area, 240 acres.
