Now that the fire season is on, there is much activity at the headquarters of the North Umpqua district of the national forest service located at Glide ranger station. Contained within the protective boundaries of this district are 250,000 acres of national forest lands and approximately 275,000 acres of privately owned land. Ship Strike Partly Broken in Two Areas

NEW YORK — (AP)—Some American-flag ships were moving in Atlantic and gulf coast ports today, but adamant CIO mariners engineers blocked full renewal of maritime activities.

The Marine Engineers Beneficial association was holding out for a hiring hall and certain overtime benefits, according to federal mediators. Their holdout meant the continuance of the 11-day maritime stoppage for many companies, including the United States lines, Grace line, Moore-McCormack lines and Farrell lines. But for companies that employ non-CIO engineers, the port tieup was over and their ships free to sail.
