## Price And Wage Controls Again In Senate Fight

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Senators are angling for a compromise in the steaming fight over government price-wage controls and price rollbacks, but no solution was in sight.

And the CIO threatened to boycott the stabilization program again unless Congress approves a program more to its liking than the one now embodied in senate and house bills.

Present authority for economic controls expires at midnight Saturday.

At hottest issue in the Senate were these clashing moves:

1. A proposal by Senator Douglas (D-Ill.) to strike out of the controls bill a drastic proposed limitation on price rollbacks.

2. A motion by Senator Williams (R-Del.) to withdraw government price support from all farm products if a price ceiling is in effect on any farm product.

Douglas frankly incited a compromise on the rollback issue, but tore into Williams' proposal without any indication of willingness to strike a deal on that one.

Senate leaders of both parties conceded it may be necessary for Congress to adopt a resolution simply extending the present controls law a month or so, to provide time for action on the extension bill.

The CIO threat to walk out of the stabilization effort was voiced by Emil Rieve, chairman of the big labor organization's committee on economic policy and a member of the Wage Stabilization board.

The program now before Congress, Rieve told newsmen, insures "nothing except the profits of business and industry."

The CIO, with the AFL and most railroad brotherhoods, boycotted the stabilization program for two months earlier this year in a dispute over wage controls and general economic policies.
