**U.S. Aid To Education Urged By California Governor**

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Gov. Earl Warren, urging federal aid to education, said "a nation that abandons its social objectives is on the road to decadence."

The 1948 Republican vice presidential nominee, regarded as a possible GOP candidate for the presidency next year, addressed the National Education Association convention here.

The California governor said some argue that the present is not a time to be talking social objectives, and even suggest a cutback would be desirable.

"The greatest of all our social objectives, of course, is to have an enlightened citizenry," Warren said. "The foundation for such a citizenry is to be found in universal public education."

"We must, therefore, strengthen our public school system, today, tomorrow, and every day, until it serves its true purpose everywhere."

Warren advocated federal aid to education to see that every child gets an even break in schooling. He said:

"There are states in America today which because of rapidly mounting school enrollments, higher living costs, and critical shortages of elementary teachers, do not and cannot, unless assisted by the federal government, maintain educational standards adequate to present-day needs."

**N.Y. Surgeon Removes Iran Shah's Appendix**

TEHRAN, Iran (AP)—An American surgeon, Dr. Frank Glenn, cut out Shah Mohammed Reza Pahlavi's appendix here and the 32-year-old ruler was reported resting comfortably.

The king, who has suffered for years from chronic appendicitis, summoned four doctors and three nurses from New York for the operation because he felt he could not leave his country during the oil crisis.

**Winchester Bay Youth Faces Charge Of Theft**

NEWBERG (AP)—Danny Lee Faulkner, 22, Winchester Bay, was arrested in Dundee early Wednesday by Police Chief Robert Colton on suspicion of breaking into and taking more than \$1000 worth of logging equipment from the Northwest Logging Supply company, McMinnville.

Colton found in the truck an iron bar with a tag of the supply company. Other articles included two power saws, valued at \$400 and \$327, two 30-inch bars, valued at \$34 each, a 50-inch bar, valued at \$37.50 and two saw chains valued at \$120 and \$300. A .22-calibre loaded automatic also was found in the truck.

The cart is believed to be the first wheeled vehicle invented.
