Pacific Pact Plan Urged By Premier Of New Zealand

AUCKLAND, New Zealand — (AP) — Prime Minister Sidney Holland says he hopes to be able soon to announce the signing of a mutual aid and assistance agreement by the United States, Australia and New Zealand.

He added: "It is hard for me to amplify this without getting into deep water, but I think it will come with the Japanese peace treaty." The Japanese peace treaty is scheduled to be signed in San Francisco early in September.

Presumably the agreement to which the prime minister referred is the projected Pacific pact which would set up a system of alliances in the Pacific similar to the Atlantic pact.

It has been reported that New Zealand and Australia hung back from negotiating the Japanese treaty until they had gained assurances from the United States of military assistance in case of a resurgence of Japanese militarism.

Holland said also that New Zealand seeks greater solidarity with the British and American peoples. "We are leading rapidly toward a close cooperation with the United States, but this shouldn't affect our relations with the United Kingdom," he declared.

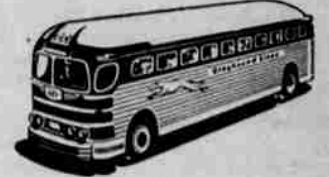
Three of the north-sector opening games in the International league were rained out this year. Montreal was the only northern club to open on schedule.

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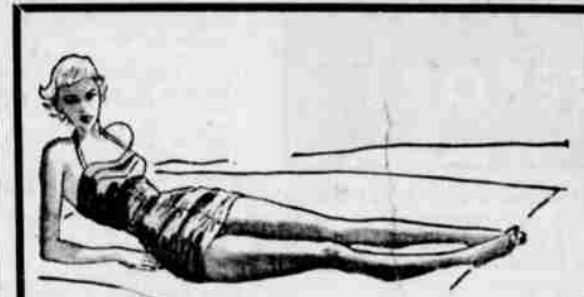
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
