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Half-Year Lumber Cut Tops Like Period in '50

PORTLAND, Ore. — Sawmills in the Douglas fir region cut nearly a billion more feet of lumber in the first six months of 1951 than during a corresponding period last year. Harris E. Smith, secretary of the West Coast Lumbermen's association said today.

Mills of the region had run up a total of 5,831,898,000 board feet by the end of June, Smith said. Last year total production for the first six months was 4,978,982,000 board feet.

Shipments kept close pace with production, Smith stated, and the first half year of 1951 saw more than half a billion feet loaded out than for the like period of 1950. Shipments for six months of 1951 total 5,827,529,000 feet compared to 5,313,585,000 feet in 1950.
