James A. Hard celebrated his birthday Sunday greeting 200 guests at a reception in the nursing home where he lives.

A birthday cake with 110 candles was presented to Hard by the local chapter of the Sons of Union Veterans. The cigars, an integral part of Hard's recipe for longevity, came from well-wishers.

Among the guests was Edward Van Dusen, Rochester's second oldest resident. He admits to 107 years.

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
